Lara unhappy over non-selection role

Brian Lara has said that he was upset about not being part of the selection panel that picked the 14member squad for the VB Series. Lara hinted that the new coach. Bennett King, had a lot of say in selection matters and the team was suffering because of his lack of experience with the West Indian

This was under a new policy where his position as captain was not confirmed until the squad had been selected. The team returned home after being forced out of the VB Series, where they won only one game, but Lara insisted that there were several gains on the tour.

"You would think that someone who is in charge of the team and had won the ICC Champions Trophy would have had something to do with the selection," Lara told the Caribbean Media Corporation, the West Indian news agency, on arrival at the Grantley Adams Airport in

"Unfortunately, this was not the case. If you have a new selection policy and there is a coach who has a lot of say in the process and does not have the experience of knowing West Indies cricket, then there will be areas in which you will fall down.

Kenyan accounts frozen

The Kenvan government on Friday froze bank accounts of trouble-(KCA), effectively grounding all its activities amid a row over the management of the sport, officials said.

All activities will remain grounded until a case instituted by the KCA against the government is heard next week, according to a KCA official who insisted on ano-

The sports ministry mid January dissolved the KCA and set up an interim committee to run the sport, pending fresh elections in April, but the sacked office bearers rushed to court challenging the decision.

Both sides, who are still in loggerheads over money and a national constitution, are expected to appear in a Nairobi court on Februarv 10.

"Until the case is decided we cannot guarantee payments to any of our employees," the KCA official added in Nairobi.

The cash freeze has effectively grounded the training sessions of the national team, which is preparing 1for the ICC Intercontinental Cup qualifying tournament against Namibia and Uganda at the end of

Manchester United boss Alex Ferguson claimed their 4-2 victory at Arsenal earlier this week was one of the best ever matches in the history of the Premiership. The Red Devils' 4-2 win ended

any hopes of the Gunners' retaining their title and left United as the only realistic challengers to runaway leaders Chelsea. Ferguson has spent the last

three days bringing his team back down to earth in time for Saturday's must-win Old Trafford clash with Birmingham. But while he insisted United were

fully primed to face Steve Bruce's men, Ferguson could not help reflecting on a powderkeg encounter that will go down as one of the alltime greats.

"Tuesday's game produced a level of football that you will not see matched many times," he said. "To get that kind of drama, inten-

of Jose Mourinho's men. Ferguson knows it would take a combination of an unexpected Chelsea collapse and the Red Devils maintaining their own impressive form for his team to stand any chance of lifting their ninth Premiership title.

However he insists his team have the potential to take advantage of any Chelsea slip and is not expecting to follow up the Arsenal victory with an miserable defeat, as occurred at Portsmouth immediately after the Gunners' 49-game unbeaten run came to a shuddering halt at Old Trafford in October.

"That was a different time," he observed. "If you create 18 chances in a match and don't take any of them like we did at Portsmouth, you don't deserve to win. But the form of the team now is far different.

"There is a confidence and a determination about the place and it didn't need the result we achieved at Highbury on Tuesday to emphasise that. It means we have now done the double over Arsenal and Liverpool in the same season, which I don't think we have done before.'
