The award was instituted in memory of eye specialist Dr Arup Midva, who died in a road accident at the age of 44.

The chief consultant of Majibunnesa Eye Hospital, Prof Modasser was a director general of the Directorate of Health and director of National Ophthalmology Institute.

He also served as head of ophthalmology department at different medical colleges.

The strategy addressed all issues and recognised all river users aimed at filling the gaps in the river management initiative taking into account the experiences of other countries and giving due consideration to impact of environment on economy, Carter said.
