

Implement short-term recommendations for quality education

Experts tell discussion

Experts at a discussion yesterday called for implementing short term recommendations of the Education Commission Report 2003 to achieve the quality education.

They said recommendations that require policy change and involve significant amount of fund should be left for mid term and long term implementation.

The Dhaka Divisional Focal Group Discussion (FGD) of the cell on implementation of the commission's recommendations was organised by the Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board, Dhaka at the Biman auditorium in the city.

"To achieve the objective of desired goals in the field of education, we have to bring about dynamism in educational administration and uphold the dignity of teachers," said Dhaka District Education Officer Mazharul Islam presenting the suggestions of his group on secondary and higher secondary education.

Assistant Director of Primary Education Directorate Tahmina Khatun on behalf of her group underscored the need for teaching English at primary level.

While presenting the suggestions on higher education, Principal of Govt Rajendra College Prof Kamal Ataur Rahman said his group has agreed on the implementation of 161 recommendations on short term basis.

The group has also suggested amendment of the University

Ordinance-1973 to address the present problems, he added.

Vice-chancellor of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology Prof Mohammad Ali Mortuza said his group has suggested short term implementation of eight recommendations in Information and Communication Technology sector.

Director of Al-Rajhi Hospital Dr Md Mofizur Rahman said it is not possible to bring down the present doctor-patient ratio of 1:4,600 to 1:3,000 even by the year 2020 with the existing number of government and private medical institutions.

Additional 40 thousand doctors would be needed to bring the doctor-patient ratio at the desired level, he said.

Principal Jainul Abedin of Tameril Millat Kamil Madrasa presented his group's suggestions on madrasa education.

The entire education sector was divided into primary and non-formal, secondary and higher secondary, madrasa, engineering and IT, agricultural and medical, and distant and women education to facilitate the discussion.

Seven groups comprising senior academics and officials were formed to prioritise the commission's recommendations for implementation.

Additional Education Secretary M Asahab Rahman was present at the discussion presided over by Chairman of Dhaka Education Board Prof Shafeda Obaed.

Woman kidnapper gets 14 years' RI

A Tribunal in Dhaka yesterday sentenced a woman to 14 years' rigorous imprisonment for kidnapping a five-year-old girl for trafficking.

Judge Mohammad Shamsul Arefin of the Fifth Special Tribunal for Prevention on Women and Children Repression gave the verdict at a jam-packed courtroom.

Accused Shanta Islam was convicted for kidnapping the victim Mou for trafficking.

After cross-examination of 7 prosecution witnesses, the tribunal gave the verdict.

In the case filed with Sabujbagh Police Station, victim's father Abdur Rahim of 135 North Mugdara at Sabujbagh in the city alleged that Shanta kidnapped his daughter Mou from in front of the Mugda Community Centre. Later, Shanta along with Mou was caught red-handed by the passers-by at the Dhaka National Stadium area at about 3:00pm on December 9, 2002.

Later, an abduction case was filed against Shanta under the

Women and Children Repression Prevention Act the same day. The investigation officer pressed charges against Shanta on February 3, 2003.

The tribunal framed charges against Shanta on September 10, 2003 and its trial began on June 10 last year.

Special Public prosecutor Rezaul Karim appeared for the state while Advocate Ashraf-Ul-Alam defended the accused.

HC quashes graft cases against Ctg mayor

Police, BNP cadres blamed for killing Jubo League leader

Jubo League, the youth front of Awami League, yesterday alleged that the police and BNP cadres tortured and killed Jubo League leader Billal Bepari and dumped his body into a water body at Maghbazar in the city.

The PJP-Jamaat alliance government has resorted to politics of killing, but no government in the past could cling to power by resorting to repression, said Jubo League Chairman Jahangir Kabir Nanok at a press conference.

He also demanded exemplary punishment to the killers of Billal.

The Jubo League chairman announced a series of anti-government agitation programmes in protest against the killing of Billal, death threat against Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Sheikh Hasina by ruling BNP men and police repression of opposition leaders and activists.

The programmes include protest rallies in all districts on February 10, in the city wards on February 12 and in upazilas on February 14, protest

procession in the capital on February 20, protest rallies in divisional headquarters on February 26 and a youth rally in Dhaka on March 1.

While nobody is brought to book in connection with the grisly August 21 grenade attack, 26 leaders and workers of AL and its front organisations were punished by a Speedy Trial Tribunal after a Jamaat leader of Madarganj upazila in Jamalpur filed a 'false case' accusing them of damaging his NGO office during hartal on February 16 last year, Nanok said.

AL Joint Secretary Obaidul Quader, AL presidium member Omar Farruk Chowdhury and Jubo League Secretary Mirza Azam MP were present at the press conference held at the AL office.

Billal Bepari, a Jubo League leader at the city ward No. 55, had been missing since the police and BNP activists chased him in Ramna area a week ago. His body was found floating in the water body on Sunday.

He had a tea stall near his house at Wireless Gate slum in Maghbazar.
