Country in volatile politics grip again

The country braces for a volatile political situation with more violence as the opposition parties are determined to force the government to resign while the government has already taken a hard-line to defuse the opposition movement.

The main opposition Awami League (AL) and its left allies are gradually intensifying the movement against the three-year-old four-party coalition through

countrywide non-stop hartals.

On the other hand, the BNP-led alliance government is firm to foil the movement that got momentum after the killing of former finance minister Shah AMS Kibria, by launching a massive crackdown on the opposition men.

Although a combined movement by the AL and the left-leaning parties hit a snag due to differences between the main opposition party and the Communist Party of

Bangladesh (CPB), they were able to reduce the gap in the recent weeks,

And now, efforts are on to bring Jatiya Party of former military ruler HM Ershad and Bikalpa Dhara Bangladesh (BDB) of ex-president Prof Badruddoza Chowdhury into the fold for a simultaneous move-

Meanwhile, heads of mission of the European Union have already expressed concern at the violence in



Sharon, Abbas declare end to violence

Israeli and Palestinian leaders proclaimed a formal end to more than four years of bloodshed at a summit

in Egypt Tuesday. Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas said he agreed with Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon to stop all violence. Sharon declared an end to military action at the meeting in Sharm el-Sheikh, which was seen as a step back toward peace talks.

"We have agreed with Prime Minister Ariel Sharon to cease all acts of violence against Israelis and Palestinians wherever they are," said Abbas at the Red Sea resort of Sharm

"The calm which will prevail in our lands starting from today is the beginning of a newera.

Sharon said: "For the first time in a long time there is hope in our region for a better future for us and our grandchildren."

It was the highest-level meeting between the sides since a Palestinian uprising blew up in 2000 after peace talks collapsed.

The two sides did not sign a formal cease-fire agreement and Israel emphasized it was dealing only with Abbas's Palestinian Authority and not the militants behind attacks.

3 outlaw leaders killed in 'crossfire'

Total number of deaths rise to 221

Three leaders of Purbo Banglar Communist Party (M-L Lal Pataka) were killed in 'crossfire' between police and the outlawed party cadres in Bagmara upazila early yester-

Of the dead, Rajshahi Regional PBCP Commander Abdur Razzak alias LG killer Razzak, 43, hailed from Santipur, District Commander Abdur Rashid Khan alias Chapati Rashid, 25, from Baroihati, and Idrish Ali alias Pistol Idrish, 44, from Beerkutsa of Bagmara.

With these three, the number of deaths in shootouts involving Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) and police since June last year rose to 221.

Detective Branch of police on Monday afternoon arrested them at Ektara Bazar in Bagmara. Following

information obtained from the arrestees, a team led by assistant superintendent of police (Puthia circle) took them to Boalipara olive orchardin Jugipara union.

As police reached the olive orchard at around 4:00am, accomplices of the three opened fire on them. Police returned fire starting a half-an-hour-long shootout. At one stage, the three while trying to flee the scene got shot.

Police took them to Bagmara Health Complex, where the doctors declared them dead.

Police recovered an Indian pistol, one local gun, two bullets and two cartridges from the scene of the shooting.

They could not show any criminal records against them, but said the three while under interrogation SEE PAGE 11 COL 8
