

Uphold country's Image: PM

Madrasa teachers calls on Khaleda

UNB, Dhaka

As madrasa teachers extended their support to the government action against extremists, Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday called for upholding Bangladesh's image as a moderate Muslim country and working for its further advancement.

She made the call when over 100 madrasa teachers under the banner of Bangladesh Jamiatul Modaresin met her at the International Conference Centre.

Jamiatul Modaresin expressed their commitment to extend all-out cooperation to any step of the government against those who are involved in the activities against the true spirit and values of Islam.

There are 2.5 lakh teachers and 40 lakh students in about 27,000 Ebtadayi, Dakhil, Alim and Kamil madrasas, the meeting was told.

Senior vice-president of the Bangladesh Jamiatul Modaresin AMM Bahauddin, also editor of the daily Inqilab, led the delegation.

They raised some demands, particularly academic recognition of Fazil and Kamil degrees equivalent to graduation and post-graduation

(master's degree), providing scope so that Fazil and Kamil certificate-holders can take part in the BCS and other examinations, and setting up an affiliating Arabic University.

The prime minister emphasised the need for working unitedly to lead the country forward as well as consolidating the country's independence and sovereignty.

Referring to recent political developments, Khaleda said all have to work and proceed cautiously so that any wrong step doesn't cause suffering to people and the country. "True spirit and values of Islam will have to be upheld."

She said her government has been working for the welfare of all sections of people — farmers, workers, students and ulama.

Education Minister Dr Osman Farruk, Moulana Mohammad Saleh, Khulna divisional president of the organisation, Moulana Shamsul Alam Chowdhury, joint secretary (Chittagong division), and Moulana Kabi Ruhul Amin Khan also spoke.

AMM Bahauddin said the mainstream Islamic parties in Bangladesh are now united under the leadership of Khaleda Zia and the unity would exist in the future.

India goes ahead with linking rivers

Say environmentalists

India is pressing ahead with its river-linking project though Indian High Commission in Dhaka had said that the project was still at a conceptual level, environment activists yesterday said.

Bangladesh Paribesh Andolon (Bapa) at a press conference yesterday expressed its worries over India's 'continuing with' river-linking programme.

Bapa President Prof Muzaffer Ahmad while speaking at the press conference held at the National Press Club said, "We must mobilise people in a movement to dissuade India from unilaterally diverting water of the transboundary rivers."

"Instead of going ahead with the project, India should undertake a review of the Farakka

Barrage," he added.

India's central government has constituted a committee headed by its water resources secretary to convince the state governments of the prospect of river-linking project, Prof Ahmad said citing from a news item run by the January issue of Indian magazine Dams, Rivers and People.

Quoting a water resources ministry letter to noted Indian environment activist Medha Patkar, Prof Ahmad said that India's National Water Development Agency had identified 30 inter-basin water transfer proposals including 16 peninsular and 14 Himalayan to be implemented by 2005.

Besides, the letter said that according to the National Common Minimum Programme, India will continue with the river-linking programme with focus on peninsular component.

If implemented, the peninsular aspect of the water transfer move, which calls for withdrawal of water

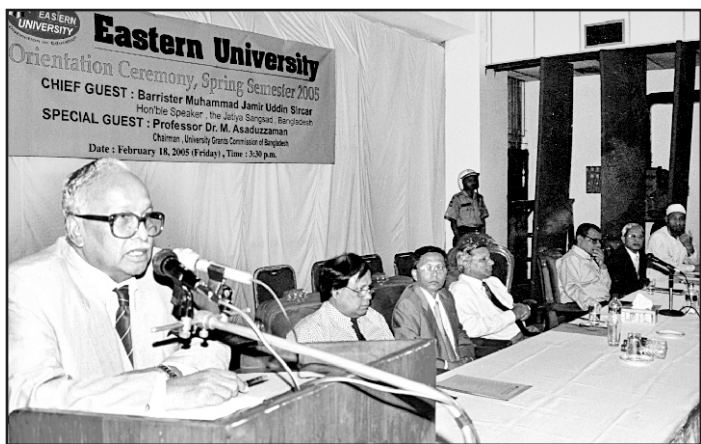
from the transboundary rivers in the upstream areas within the Indian territory, will be hazardous for Bangladesh, said Prof Ahmad.

It is disappointing that the Bangladesh government has not yet officially registered any concern or protest against the move, he added.

India should recognise that its river-linking project is based on an ecologically unsound premise and stop proceeding especially with the Himalayan component of the project, Ahmad said adding that India must address its neighbours' legitimate concerns regarding transboundary rivers.

Bapa Joint Secretary Dr M Abdul Motin said that his organisation is gearing up for a movement at national, regional, and international levels for an ecological approach to rivers.

M Feroze Ahmed and Syed ANM Wahed, among other Bapa officials, were present at the press conference.

Speaking on the occasion, Amanullah Khan hoped that the participants would use the knowledge, skill and tools acquired during the workshop to "save the beautiful and wonderful species, called the world's greatest cat, from extinction."

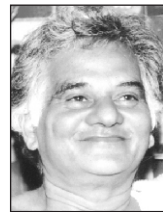
