Punishment to culprits demanded

Bangladesh Mahila Parishad yesterday demanded exemplary punishment to the persons responsible for the death of Mousumi Hasan, a student of Asia Pacific University.

She died on February 26 at a city hospital after fighting for life for 11 days. A case was filed with Mohammadpur police station against her husband Emon accusing him of injecting Mousumi with poison that led

Mousumi's father Daud Hasan said her daughter died because of her husband's addiction to drug and

Husband goes into hiding

A mother of a seven-month-old daughter succumbed to her burn injuries at a city hospital yesterday nine days after her husband allegedly set fire to her at the Geneva Camp in the city. Farzana Begum, 20, wife of

Mohammad Islam alias Sistay, was admitted to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) on February

Her father Mohammad Reza told reporters that Islam threw a type of chemical on his daughter and set her on fire at their Geneva Camp house at Mohammadpur at around 3:30am on February 20.

Farzana received burn injuries on her body from knee to neck.

Her father said he did not lodge any complaint against his son-in-law

Clash over reinstatement of former headmaster at Manipur High School: 10 injured

Ten people were injured at Manipur High School in the city yesterday when students, guardians and local people clashed over the reinstatement of a former headmaster.

The clash erupted after the ncumbent Headmaster Belayet Hossain Sikder refused to hand over the charge to former headmaster Mohammad Sabder Ali, who was removed from his post a couple of

Sabder Ali, who received a court order in his favour, went to the school at around 12.30pm to claim his post

As Sikder refused to hand over the chair, two groups were locked into an altercation, leading to clashes. Three students -- Sayeed, Mridul and Mamun -- were also

Local people said Sabder Ali had been serving as headmaster much before independence, but that the ex-officio chairman of the governing body of the school forced him to resign three months ago.

Later, Belayet Hossain Sikder, an assistant teacher of the school, took charge of the headmaster with the support from the local MP, they said. However, duty officer of Mirpur

Police Station said no such clashes took place there but that police rushed to the school to avoid any untoward incident and settled the matter peacefully.

The International Farakka Committee (IFC) will stage a long march towards Chilmari in Kurigram district from March 3 in protest against the Indian river inter-linking

project Mar 3, 4

"We invite all to take part in the long march against the Indian mega project, which, once implemented, will cause colossal damage to Bangladesh's environment and economy," said IFC Chairman Atiqur RK Eusufzai at a press conference yesterday. The march will start from the

National Press Club premises in the city at 9:00am on March 3 with a convoy of 80 to 100 buses travelling across Tangail, Bogra, Sirajganj and Rangour districts, he said. More participants will join the

march at different points along the route and the demonstrators will assemble at Chilmari river port by

A grand rally will be held on the bank of Brahmaputra in Chilmari in the morning on March 4, which is expected to stage a massive showdown against the proposed riverlinking project, the IFC chairman

Demonstrators from Roumari will also take part in the long march with a procession of boats, he added.

The IFC leaders called on all, irrespective of political affiliation, profession or religion, to take part in the long march to raise a voice against the India's unilateral move

to withdraw water from the transboundarv rivers.

The IFC is a New York-based environmentalist forum of Bangladeshi expatriates
