would cancel these dealerships. Speaker Jamiruddin Sircar, who was chairing the session, joined the lawmakers and told the industries

his Panchagarh district has got a single tonne of fertiliser so far.

He urged the minister to look into the matter and take necessary

During the question-answer session, Jatiya Party (Ershad) lawmaker Hafizuddin Ahmed raised the issue of irregularities. BNP lawmakers Helaluzzaman Talukder Lalu and AKM Selim Reza Habib supported his allegation.

In reply, Nizami said it is not correct that all dealers were appointed during the Awami League government. Rather, every government had appointed some of the

He said a five-member committee has been formed to review the matter for ensuring smooth distribution of fertilisers in remote areas. The committee will examine the appointment of dealers and file a report by the end of this month. Further steps would be taken on the basis of the report, he said.

### Tata firm on investing \$2b

Tata, India's industrial giant, will go ahead with its plan to invest in Bangladesh, as several projects involving an initial capital of about \$2 billion remained under study.

"We are committed to taking nvestment to Bangladesh...when say we want to invest, we really mean it," said Ratan Tata, chairman of the corporate house, talking to a group of visiting Bangladeshi journalists here yesterday.

"We have warm feelings for your country," he added.

Talking briefly and exclusively to the Bangladeshi newsmen at the Founder's Day ceremony marking the 166th birth anniversary of Jamshedji Tata, the founder of the Tata Group, Ratan said his company has been seriously studying the proposed projects for Bangladesh.

# 'Crossfire' kills 22, scares away 25

'Crossfire' death has scared away most of the local listed top terrors into hiding or shelters at home and

Sources said almost all the underworld linchpins of the district and the port city, who have managed to survive the Rapid Action Battalion's (Rab) crackdown on terrorists, are now lying low in Dubai, Kolkata, Dhaka or somewhere far away from Chittagong.

According to them, at least 25 die-hard gangster are now in hiding or leading underground life, after 22 terrorists including 'Gittu' Nasir have died one after another in 'crossfire' since the elite anti-crime force launched its operation here on May

They said Rab-7 stationed in Chittagong is determined to root out the terrorists on its hit list.

"We know what we're supposed to do and will continue our antiterrorism operations," said Rab-7

Acting Commander Major Sharif Hasan yesterday afternoon.

Declining to detail their plan about the terrorists on the run, he just said, "None of the terrorists accused in specific and grievous criminal cases would be spared." According to sources, Mamunur

### PM opens waterway around Dhaka

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday inaugurated the 26.5-km Swarighat-Ashulia circular waterway around the capital that will ease a nagging pressure on the city's communications network through providing cheaper and cleaner transportation facility.

In the first phase of the waterway project, people can now travel and carry goods from Ashulia to Swarighat trading heartland of Dhaka

About one lakh people are expected to commute and 6.000 tonnes of goods to be carried on the new route of communications.

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) is implementing the Tk 35.99-crore Circular Waterways Project, which will particularly alleviate traffic load on the Narayanganj-Dhaka land

The total project will have 10

landing stations at Swarighat, Kholamora, Lalbagh, Basila, Rayerbazar, Gabtali, Amin Bazar, Shirnirtek. Berulia and Ashulia. The stations will be completed by the end of this year. Khaleda inaugurated the water-

way unveiling the plaque of the Ashulia landing station. Addressing the opening function

## China blast kills 20 school children

A dynamite explosion in a north China village killed 20 primary schoolchildren when their classroom collapsed on top of them, state media said on Thursday.

The dynamite, stored illegally in a coal mine owner's house in Puxian county, Shanxi province, buried the children and some of their teachers at the nearby school, the Beijing News said.

The mine owner was also killed in the blast, the Beijing News said. Explosives or fireworks manufactured and stored illegally kill hundreds each year in China's rural

Six thousand miners died last year in accidents and explosions that made the industry the world's deadliest and forced work-place safety on to the agenda at the annual session of parliament which starts on Saturday.

An official with the county government in coal-rich Puxian said many private coal mine owners possessed large quantities of "But it is illegal to keep the explo-

sives at home," he said. Local police said they were unable to give further details.

The New York-based rights group, Human Rights in China, reported another grisly breach of work-place safety in northern Hebei province where five child factory workers died from asphyxiation caused by a charcoal heater, two apparently inside coffins.

"Due to the substandard conditions in the factory dormitory, five girls were found unconscious from inhaling charcoal fumes at the end of last year," the group said in a statement.

"Sources say that without checking if the girls were actually dead, (the factory owner) put them into coffins for cremation, with the result that two of the girls who were apparently still alive died of asphyxiation."

### Teachers hold token hunger strike

Protest killings, rise of fundamentalist forces

Around 50 teachers from different universities and colleges joined the hunger strike from 10:00am to 1:00pm.

Leaders of different social and professional bodies came to the venue to express solidarity with the federation's programme.

### Chinese PM arrives on April 7


