They submitted that the authorities had purportedly replaced the constitution under which they were elected in 2001. The impugned constitution was imposed with a malafide motive of controlling by a vested quarter the cricket of Bangladesh which is gaining attraction in the world cricket.

Earlier, on March 1 the Supreme Court staved the High Court order reinstating the directors of BCB and had ordered the authorities to hold election at the earliest.
