Tūllow strikes gas in Bhangura

Tullow Oil Plc has discovered about half a trillion cubic feet (TCF) of gas at Bhangura in the block 9.

However, the Irish oil company will disclose the commercial prospect later.
"It wants to make the announce-

ment after test production for six months from November or December this year," said an official

at Petrobangia.

The Tullow yesterday made a presentation before the officials of Petrobangla, the state-run oil, gas and mineral corporation.

Hasina to talk terrorism

Leaves for Spain

Leader of the Opposition Sheikh Hasina yesterday said she is going to Spain to attend an international seminar against terrorism to mobilse world opinion against the alliance government patronised grenade and bomb attacks, killings, terrorism and human rights abuses.

The organisers of Madrid summit wanted to know about continuous terrorism, human rights viola-

tions and torture and repression by the BNP-Jamaat alliance government from me. I myself am the victim of terrorism by the alliance government," she told journalists at the Zia International Airport on her way to Spain.

Hasina will take part in a four-day international summit of former heads of the state and government. More than 200 participants from 52 countries from across the globe will

said a nephew of Nazneen's husband has been missing since the

Dr Nazneen, wife of Doctor Afsanuzzaman of Nutrition Science Institute at Dhanmondi, worked at Suhrawardy Hospital and was posted at a government healthcare clinic at Segunbagicha.

Dr Nazneen, the domestic help and Dr Afsan's nephew Aminul, madrasa student, used to live on the second floor of the 13/1, Central

Rab seizes 140kg explosives from bus

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) yesterday seized 140kg of explosive substances, 90 bottles of phensidyl, 64 cans of Indian pesticide and arrested one person from a Kuakata-bound bus near Jhenidah Police Lines.

Seized explosive substances are used for making powerful bombs, Rab sources said.

The arrestee, Minnat Ali, 40, of Kaliganj upazila in Jhenidah, is being quizzed at the Rab headquarters in Khulna.

Acting on a tip-off, a Rab team conducted a search in the passenger-bus from Jessore and found the items kept in four cartoons.

Crackdown not linked PM okays body to Islamist militants

Babar says he is not familiar with term 'crossfire'

State Minister for Home Affairs Lutfozzman Babar yesterday told the Jatiya Sangsad that the government's ongoing crackdown is not related to Islamic fundamentalism, rather it is to make an overall improvement in law and order.

When Jatiya Party (Ershad) lawmaker Moshiur Rahman Ranga said that recent steps by the government have succeeded in containing lawlessness caused by the religious fundamentalists, Babar said, "I don't agree with you. What we are doing is not related to fundamentalism, it's to improve law and order."

Replying to another query by the JP lawmaker, the minister quoting yesterday's newspaper reports said Bangla Bhai has possibly fled the country, still, the police administration has been instructed to arrest him. "We are committed to take legal actions against the persons who are trying to disrupt law and order," he added.


