### Revenge not on Inzy's mind; Sourav nervous to be favourites

Pakistan captain Inzamamul Haq said Monday India would plan to capitalise on the absence of his key paceman

Shoaib Akhtar by preparing a fast track for the opening Test here. "I think Akhtar's absence has

prompted India to leave grass on the pitch," Inzamam said on the eve of the first Test of a threematch series

But he felt Akhtar's absence would not be a big handicap, saying he had support bowlers to deliver in the pressure series. Pakistan's first in India in six years.

"I think the pitch will help seamers more than spinners on the first couple of days. If it (grass) remains on the track, it will give equal chances to both the teams as we have adequate back-up." he said. Akhtar had bulled out of the tour

due to a hamstring injury Inzamam, leading an inexperienced side, said it was up to senior players to show the way to youngsters against a full-strength Indian

"Pressure is always there in the

India-Pakistan series," he said.

"It's necessary for experienced batsmen to show more responsibility. I know I have to perform both as captain and batsman to set an example. We may not be favourites, but are capable of winning the

Inzamam said his team had come not to avenge last year's defeats, but to play competitive

"Revenge is not on our minds." said Inzamam, whose team lost both the Test and one-day series against India at home last year.

"We know India have an edge as they have experienced players. We may be inexperienced, but not weak and I'm confident we can win." he said.

Inzamam felt leg-spinner Danish Kaneria could play a key role as the pitch was also expected to help spin.

"He (Kaneria) has been our key spinner for the past couple of years. He can be dangerous and win matches single-handedly.' said Inzamam.

Only three players in the Pakistan squad, Shahid Afridi, Yousuf Youhana and Inzamam, have played Tests in India, when

they drew 1-1 in 1999 and won an Asian Test Championship game.

"With India and Pakistan there will be tension, whether you are travelling for the first time or fourth time." Inzamam said.

On the other hand, India are under pressure as favourites to win the much-awaited home Test series, according to their captain Souray Ganguly

"Every cricket player is a bit nervous before the start of the first Test," Ganguly told reporters on Monday. "Things change as you get into the series.

Ganguly had at his disposal a full-strength bowling attack as seamers Laxmipathy Balaji and Ashish Nehra had returned after being out of Test cricket for nearly a year due to injuries.

"It's good to pick the best eleven after a long time. We'll choose the side that suits the conditions," said Ganguly, who is likely to go into the match with three fast bowlers. India included three pacemen --

Irfan Pathan, Zaheer Khan and Balaii -- and two spinners -- Anil Kumble and Harbhajan Singh -- in the twelve announced for the Ganguly did not believe his

team would find it easy just because they more experienced than their rivals.

"True, we are a balanced side but cricket is not played on paper. What matters is how you perform on the field. Pakistan are a young team and we'll have to play really well to win the series," he said.

### **Emphatic win for Ctg**

Despite struggling in the one-day table, limited-overs champions Chittagong kept up their quest for the first-class title when they romped to a nine-wicket win over Khulna in the fourth round of the Ispahani Sixth National Cricket League yesterday.

Chittagong joined Dhaka on top of the longer-version table with their second outright win in the competition. Both sides are now level on 18 points after Dhaka's four-wicket defeat of Raishahi on Sunday.

In the other match, centuries by numbers seven and eight helped Sylhet pull off a draw against hosts Barisal who collected four points by virtue of their first-innings lead.

Sylhet, however, crashed to the bottom of the table with six points. Rajshahi are second on 12 points, followed by Khulna and Barisal on ten and eight points respectively. CHITTAGONG-KHULNA

Khulna avoided an innings defeat due to some stubborn batting from the tail that stretched their second

innings beyond tea on the final day at the Chittagong Divisional Stadium. The visitors needed 131 runs to

force Chittagong to bat again when they resumed on 148-3. But they lost overnight pair Sazzadul Hasan and Monirul Islam in the space of four runs to stumble to 172-5. Sazzad added three runs to his overnight 52 while Monirul, the firstinnings hero with an unbeaten 87,

Wickets kept tumbling but the home side were kept waiting by Khulna seamers Manjurul Islam and Dollar Mahmud who put on 116 runs for the ninth wicket after coming together at 211-8. Skipper Manjurul remained not out on 49, the southpaw hitting four boundaries in 130 balls, while number ten Dollar smashed nine fours in his 141-ball

Khulna eventually finished on

327 when left-arm spinner Ilias Sunny dismissed Ziaur Rahman for a two-ball duck, leaving Maniurul stranded just one short of the fiftyrun landmark

Ilias finished with 4-73 while Habib Moballik, who captured 3-72, ended the match with seven wick-

However, the man-of-the-match award went to stand-in skipper Ehsanul Haque, who took a match haul of five wickets apart from scoring a century in the Chittagong first innings.

The hosts, who were set a meagre 48-run target, stormed to 52-1 in just seven overs. Nazimuddin spearheaded the chase with a blistering 24-ball 39 studded with half a dozen fours and one six.

## **BFF** goes Argentine

Hoping to inject some desperately needed enterprise to revive the game in the country, the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) has decided to go for Latin

American inspiration. The BFF's executive committee met yesterday to approve the appointment of two high profile coaches and a fitness trainer from Argentina after evaluating a shortlist over the last couple of months.

BFF general secretary Anwarul Haque Helal confirmed the appointments of Vicente Cayetano

Rodriguez as head coach and his compatriot Diego Andres Cruciani as the national under-23 coach. Both men are highly experienced and had worked under the legendary Cesar Luis Menotti, Argentina's

1974 World Cup winning coach. "They have accepted our proposal through their agent and we are expecting them to join us within two months. We are planing to strike a two-vear contract with them and the terms and conditions will be finalised within a short time," said Helal after the meeting yesterday. Meanwhile, fitness trainer Deboli Hugo Antonio, who also hails from Argentina, has declined to accept the BFF offer due to family reasons. The BFF is already on the lookout

for a replacement for Hugo.

61-year old Rodriguez had coached Haiti in 2002-2003 and the Caribbean side stayed unbeaten in international matches during his tenure. He was also instrumental in taking Mexico to the 1994 World Cup in the United States when he was the second man to Menotti during the qualifiers.

"Both Rodriguez and Cruciani are high profile coaches and we believe their presence will definitely have a huge impact on our game. But first of all, we have to change our total football structure and bring professionalism and we are ready to take up that challenge," said Helal. A visibly excited Helal said that

## The unresolved puzzle

The great Indian rope trick may have belonged to the realm of imagination, but not the spin trick which still puzzles and bewilders visiting batsmen.

Pakistan were left nonplussed in the New Delhi Test in 1999 when India's incredible leg-spinner Anil Kumble became only the second bowler in the game's history after Englishman Jim Laker to claim 10 wickets in a Test innings.


