#### 9 Indians engaged to build PM's dais held

## Reining in BNP MPs

#### They have to take permission before placing bill in JS

The government has imposed a restriction on the ruling BNP lawmakers asking them to take permission from the Leader of the House or the party's parliamentary wing before placing a private member's bill in parliament.

The law, justice and parliamentary affairs minister recently issued the instruction and sent a copy of it to the speaker, sparking severe criticism from lawmakers of the BNP as well as other parties.

Many legislators consider the law minister's move as a gross violation of the Rules of Procedure of the Jatiya Sangsad. And it led to a heated debate between Law Minister Moudud Ahmed and a ruling BNP lawmaker at a parliamentary body meeting yesterday, meeting sources

BNP lawmaker Abdul Mannan said at the meeting the move is in contradiction with parliamentary democracy and urged the minister to 'redefine' private members.

"The instruction differs with the 12th amendment to the constitution through which parliamentary democracy has been introduced, Mannan said.

The parliamentary standing committee on Rules of Procedure headed by Speaker Jamiruddin Sircar asked the law minister to sit with the legislator to resolve the

But the minister refused to do so saying he has just acted as per a government decision. He asked the member to raise the issue at the BNP parliamentary party meeting, the

Road accidents kill nine

At least nine people died and 34 others were injured in road accidents at Tangail, Narayanganj and Keraniganj yesterdayandon Fridaynight. In Tangail, Sarwar Hossain, 35,

his wife and two minor daughters died on the spot and four others were injured when a van rammed a tempo at Rasulpur on the Tangail-Mymensingh highway at about

4:00pmyesterday.

The injured are undergoing treatment at Tangail General Hospital. Police seized the van, but its driver managed to flee.

A report from Narayanganj said three people died on the spot and 20 others were injured when a Monohardi bound bus from Dhaka plunged into roadside ditch at Banty at about 11:00pm on Friday. The victims could not be identified. The injured were admitted to different hospitals and clinics.

In Keraniganj, two persons died and ten others were injured when a Shariatpur bound bus from Dhaka skidded off the road and fell into a ditch at Rajendrapur on Dhaka-Mawa road at about 11:30pm on Friday. The victims could not be identified.

## HC asks chief to explain his appointment

The High Court yesterday ordered Justice Sultan Hossain Khan to explain under what authority he is functioning as chairman of the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC).

The bench of Justice Shah Abu Nayeem Muminur Rahman and Justice Mainul Islam Chowdhury issued the order that applies also to the government. It is returnable in eight weeks.

The court order came in response to a public interest litigation (PIL) filed by Aminul Haque Helal, a Supreme Court lawyer. The claim challenges the November 21, 2004 appointment of Justice Sultan

Hossain Khan, a former chief election commissioner (CEC), as ACC

"As per article 118 of the constitution, a person who has once served as CEC is not eligible for appointment to any post in the service of the republic," Aminul Haque said in his petition.

He contended that Justice Sultan's appointment as ACC chairman is contrary to the article as he served the office of the CEC from February 17, 1990 to December 24,

Besides, Justice Sultan's appointment violates also article 99 of the constitution that prohibits a retired SEE PAGE 11 COL 6

#### Criminal killed in 'shootout'

An alleged criminal was killed in a 'shootout' with police in Maghbazar

in the early hours yesterday. Police however claimed Abdul Khaleq, 35, an accused in five criminal cases, was killed by bullets shot by his accomplices.

On information, Ramna police rushed to a lane beside Piasi Restaurant on Tongi Diversion Road at 2:30am to nab Khaleq, said a

police press release. "The police team came under fire and retaliated," the press release said, adding, Khaleq's two accomplices fled by a motorcycle and another escaped jumping over a

"Bullets fired by the criminals hit Khaleq all over his body, Sub-inspector (SI) Abu Bakar in the left leg and SI Syed Naser Ali in the right hand," the release added.

SI Bakar and Naser were admitted to Rajarbagh Police Lines Hospital, it said.

### 3 killed, 50 hurt in Narayanganj boiler blast

At least three people including a woman and a child were killed and about 50 others were wounded in a dyeing factory boiler explosion at Uttar Kashipur, Fatullah in Narayanganj early yesterday. Locals said at least 13 people who

were working at the Rapid Dyeing during the explosion, have gone missing after the incident. They alleged that the factory

owner shifted the critically wounded workers to some other The victims, dead and wounded,

suffered shock waves or were struck with remains of the houses as the severe explosion completely damaged 10 to 12 semi-pucca houses, police and locals said. The dead Tofazzel Hossain, 45,

his 12-year-old daughter Ritu and Sheuli Begum, 25, a garment worker, resided in nearby houses.

Eighteen of the wounded were admitted to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) while the rest were treated at different local clinics

Fourteen of the 24 identified wounded are relatives of dead Tofazzel, our Narayanganj correspondent reports.

They are Tofazzel's son Shyamal, vife Salma Begum, mother-in-law Joygun Bibi, brother Sirajul Islam, Sirajul's wife Roksana, sons Russell, Masud, Shakhawat, Tofazzel's another brother Jahangir, his sons Mohsin and Russell, daughter Shammi and sister-in-law Moni, and Tofazzel's another brother

Other identified wounded are Sony, Mala, Parveen, Sumaia, Lili Begum, Selim, Shirin, Runa, factory workers Baset and Sohel.

## Saifur's salvo at diplomats 'violating norms'

Bashes media again for 'false' news to destroy image

Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman yesterday blasted the news media for publishing what he said were false news and thus destroying the country's image abroad.

Besides, he accused some unnamed foreign diplomats in Dhaka of 'violating diplomatic norms and getting involved in the internal politics of the country'.

He was speaking as the chief guest at the concluding ceremony of the fourth International Poultry Show and Seminar 2005 at city's Bangladesh-China Friendship

Conference Centre. He said that the foreign envoys should confine their activities to diplomatic area in accordance with the code of conduct. But instead they violate the code by going

He claimed that the 'most damage' to the nation was caused by 100

to 150 newspapers in the country These papers are out to destroy the image of the country' by publishing false news every day.

Saifur claimed that price hike of essentials, especially that of rice, is 'nothing much' if it is set in the context of the people's purchase capacity that grew robustly over the last two decades.

#### 5 years in school, still non-literate

Campe survey depicts dismal education situation

The standard of primary education is so poor that even after the fiveyear schooling one in every three children remains 'non-literate' or 'semi-literate', according to the findings of a survey.

The survey, Education Watch terday, 2003-04, conducted by Campaign for Popular Education (Campe) in 10 upazilas also found one out of five children cannot enrol in primary schooling while one in every three of

those enrolled drops out before

completing the five-year course. "The large majority of children, two out of three, mostly poor and disadvantaged in other ways, grow up without basic skills and preparation for life," read the survey report released at a press conference yes-

#### Govt to track down manpower agents


aviation ministry would be called soon to evolve an effective mechanism to stop such deceitful busi-


