Power from Barapukuria No rail tracks yet for Magura AL council now plant in November

One unit of the 250 MW Barapukuria the officials said. Power Plant in Dinajpur, the first coal-based power plant in the country, will start generation in November this year.

The plant will generate 125 MW electricity from one unit and double its production by March next year when the second unit will be in operation, according to officials at the plant.

This will greatly ease the power crisis in the northern districts, they said. About 76 per cent work of the Tk

1650 crore plant has been completed, the officials informed State Minister for Power Iqbal Hasan Mahmood during his visit to the plant on Saturday. The plant will use coal from Barapukuria coal mine, which is yet to be ready for coal extraction

The coal reserves are enough to feed the power plant for 30 years,

The power plant is being built under the supervision of Bangladesh Power Development

Board (BPDB) officials. During the visit, the State nister asked project officials to complete the work in time to ease

the power crisis in northern districts. Besides load-shedding, lowvoltage in power supply is affecting irrigation of IRRI-Boro lands during the peak season now. Many deep

and sallow tube wells often trip due to low voltage, causing sufferings to The State Minister held a meeting with Rajshahi divisional commissioner, deputy commissioners of eight districts and officials of PDB,

The meeting took some deci-

sions including introduction of loadstaggering system for ensuring power supply for irrigation by shedding load in urban areas.

The minister also directed the deputy commissioners to create awareness among people, particularly owners of shopping centres, petrol pumps, laundry shops and welding factories to curtail power consumption during peak hours. Consumers who need high voltage have been advised to use generators during peak hours.

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia on April 23, 2003 inaugurated construction of the plant being built on 300 acres of land.

As the plant will not use any imported fuel, it will save 2000 Rural Electrification Board and million US dollars in 30 years, Power Grid Company, Bangladesh sources said. and reviewed the power supply

Seized bomb defused by Rangpur police

The powerful bomb which was seized from Alhajnagar in Kotwali police station on Friday was defused cautiously in Rangpur Police Lines here on Sunday. A police officer, preferring anonymity, told this correspondent, the bomb was very powerful and sophisticated, although it was locally made. It was installed with a battery connected with a pair of cable. The police officer told journalists it was a remote control bomb which possessed the power of collapsing a two-storied building easily. Army experts kept the bomb in water for 60 hours to lessen its power However, there had been no headway in the police investigation till filing of the report
