AL for reforms in caretaker govt system before polls

Awami League leaders yesterday demanded that reforms be brought to the caretaker government system before the next general ledition.

They also warned that they would resist any election under the

present system.

"We will not only boycott the next parliament election under the faulty caretaker government system but also prevent the government from holding any election under such system," AL presidium member Zillur Rahman said at a

discussion.

Bangladesh Krishak League organised the discussion to mark the 'Farmer killing day'. A total of 18 farmers were killed across the country on this day in 1995 while they were agitating to press for their demand for supply of fertiliser.

Zillur said the nation is now united on the question of reforming the caretaker government system.

"The AL leaders and workers along with the mass people estab-

lished the caretaker government system for a free and fair election, but the present four-party alliance government has destroyed the system in a bid to capture the power again," he observed.

The AL leader also said the government has raised the prices of diesel and kerosene several times, causing much suffering to the poor farmers

"The farmers will have to pay an extra amount of Tk 551 crore in the current season alone due to increasing prices of fuel oil," said AL Organising Secretary Abdul Mannan.

Although the agriculture forms the base of the country's economy, the government never stands beside the poor farmers, he added.

AL leader Rahmat Ali MP, Krishak League General Secretary Motahar Hossain Molla, Vice-President Harunur Rashid Howlader, MA Wadud and Chhabi Biswas also spoke at the discussion, chaired by Krishak League President Dr Mirza Jalil.

Islami Chhatra Shibir is the student wing of ruling Jamaat-e-

The injured Sirajul Islam, Fazlul Haque and Mamunur Rashid, second year students of Islamic Studies Department and residents of Jahurul Haque Hall and Salimullah Hall, were admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

The combine organisations led by the opposition Awami League's student front Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) staged a demonstration protesting the Shibir activities in different educational institutions across the country with a vow to resist them.

The Shibir activists were beaten up in front of the Arts Building where the pro-opposition student organisations were holding a rally. The student leaders found ICS books and documents from the bags of Shibir activists and began to beat them up, witnesses said.

The Shibir men led by their DU

unit organising secretary Mohammad Akhter Hossain lodged complaint to Proctor Prof. AKA Firoz Ahmed demanding punishment to the persons responsible for the

incident.

Meanwhile, the six combine organisations demanded ban on Jamaat-Shibir politics in the educational institutions across the coun-

Addressing the rally at the foot of Aparajeyo Bangla, the combine leaders said that Jamaat and its student wing Islami Chhatra Shibir have been destroying the congenial educational atmosphere of the public universities and colleges. The Jamaat and Shibir were on mission to turn secular Bangladesh into a fundamentalist state, they added.

BCL President Liaqat Sikder said the Shibir men have been attacking their leaders and activists in different educational institutions across the country and planing to destroy the congenial atmosphere of DU. He denied the allegation of assaulting of a reporter.
