

Abul Mansur's 26th death anniversary today

The 26th death anniversary of Abul Mansur Ahmad, a renowned litterateur, journalist and statesman of the today, says a press release.

The Abul Mansur Ahmad Memorial Committee has organised doa mahfils at Dhaka and Mymensingh to mark the day.

One of the greatest satirist of Bengali literature, Abul Mansur Ahmad was also a renowned politician, lawyer and a very powerful journalist. He was the editor of the Daily Krishak, Nabajug and Ittehad in undivided Bengal and a pioneer in progressive journalism.

A very successful politician, Abul Mansur Ahmad was the provincial education minister in the United Front cabinet under Sher-e-Bangla AK Fazlul Huq and the central commerce and industries minister of the Awami League government of Prime Minister Hossain Shaheed Suhrawardy. He was known for his strong stand in matters of interest of the then East Bengal.

His publications include great satires such as Aina, Asmani Purdah, Gulliverer Safar Nama and Food Conference. His works also include great writings on social and political history of Bengal. He has two autobiographical writings Atma Katha (About myself) and Amar Dekha Rajnitir Panchash Bachar (50 years of politics as have seen it).

Abul Mansur Ahmad always propagated secularism in a manner unparalleled in the forties, fifties and sixties. His contribution towards opposition movement in the early days of Pakistan was extremely significant

He wrote about the language issue from early forties and contributed to the Language Movement as the editor of the Ittehad.

He was the author of the election manifesto of Jukta Front (a grand coalition of the three giants of our politics -- Sher-e-Bangla Fazlul Huq, Moulana Bhashani and Shaheed Suhrawardy) in 1954 election through which the Muslim League was ousted from power. The 21-point programme (Ekush Dafa) was the first comprehensive articulation of the political, economic and cultural demands of the Bengalis of the then eastern part of Pakistan.

The Bangla Academy has recently published three volumes of Abul Mansur's collected works. Three more volumes are under

Abul Mansur Ahmad was one of the greatest political personalities of Bangladesh who combined rare talents in three distinct fields -politics, journalism and literary

boats begins at the National Museum tomorrow for the city dwellers to have a glimpse of the water transports plying in different regions of the country. The exhibition will feature an array

of country boats such as Patam Fishing, Shandi, Shampan and Horonga

A total of 90 boats will be displayed in the exhibition, which will continue till April 6. The boats were made using exactly the same technique and materials as the originals.

The boats, collected from different parts of the country, are now on the verge of extinction, said the organisers at a press conference yesterday.

The exhibition titled 'Traditional Boats of Bengal' was jointly organised by the Friendship Association and the German embassy in association with the National Museum and the Design of Technology Centre (DTC). GrameenPhone. Mutual Trust Bank and Bengal Foundation are the sponsors of the exhibition.

Prof Abdullah Abu Sayeed, chairman of World Literature Centre, will inaugurate the show at 6.00pm.

The exhibition will offer the visitors an opportunity to watch carpenters working on the boat and to look at the original boat materials and commodities carried by the boats, said Runa Khan Marre, executive director of the Friendship Association.

"Bangladesh is a good place for traditional boats and it seems an urgent matter to raise awareness about cultural and social heritage, said Guido Genrich of the German

Chandra Sekhar Saha, senior designer of the DTC, said they had collected designs of different types of boats from different parts of the -- Barisal, Sundarbans, Teknaf, Sandwip, Khulna and Rajshahi over the last 10 years and made the boats for the exhibition

'Unplanned habitation responsible for illness'

Unplanned habitation in the city is causing people, especially the children, physical and mental illness, said speakers at a round table organised by Save Environment Movement yesterday in the city. "Environment of a city influences

the behavioral pattern of its inhabitants," said architect Rafiq Azam while presenting his paper. Azam stressed that a living place should not be entirely detached from the nature.

He said the sun path, green house effect and sub-tropical climate of Bangladesh should be considered before planning for a house here.

"It is possible to provide a piece of green in every household no matter how much of space there is," he said referring to a five-storied apartment complex at Khazedewan in the old part of the city. The building has 14 small apartments of 500, 600 and 700 square feet, but miniature gar-

dens exist in all of them. "Children in the city are being unhealthy environment in and around their households," said Dr Manzur Hossain, Professor of Dhaka Shishu Hospital. He said children suffer from asthma, respiratory tract infection, bronchitis, hypertension and insomnia, impaired hearing due to air and sound pollution. Moreover, he suggested house-
