NBR probes import, duty mismatch

Tariff cut, customs corruption thought to be main reasons

The National Board of Revenue (NBR) is looking into why the revenue collection from import grew only by eight percent in July to December 2004, when imports marked a 23 percent growth.

NBR sources said an unusual increase in imports of zero- and low-

2 killed, 100 injured in season's first nor'wester

The country last night experienced the season's first major nor'wester with heavy rain that left at least two people dead and over 100 wounded.

Met office said the nor'wester that lashed the capital and its surrounding areas at about 7:45pm lasted for some 20 minutes, blowing off many roadside billboards, lightand signposts, but bringing a relief after a hot and humid day.

Forty-five Chittagong-based journalists in a joint statement yesterday offered to go to jail as a gesture of sympathy to their fellow professionals punished by the High Court on Monday.

"We are ready to receive voluntary imprisonment to stand beside our fellow journalists at the time of their distress," the statement said.

The High Court on Monday convicted and fined the editors, publishers and three reporters of The Daily Prothom Alo and Daily Bhorer Kagoj for contempt of court for running a report that an additional judge had "tampered" with his law school graduation exam
