The Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) yesterday renamed another road from Science Laboratory to Peelkhana BDR gate as Bir Uttam MA Rabb Road after late major general (retd.) MA Rabb.

In a bid to introduce great freedom fighters to the new generation, the DCC had recently taken the initiative of renaming five city roads after five sector commanders of the Liberation War.

As part of that drive, the DCC on Monday renamed the road from Panthapath-Sonargaon crossing to Russell Square as Bir Uttam Quazi Nuruzzaman Road, and on Sunday it renamed the link road from Mohakhali crossing at Jal Khabar to Gulshan Circle-1 as Bir Uttam AK Khandaker Road after the sector commanders.
