



Hasina insists on caretaker

participate in the next polls without electoral reforms as demanded by the opposition

The Awami League chief, who returned home in the early hours vesterday after a month-long foreign trip, said her party and other mainstream opposition parties are now working out a common formula on these reforms.

"We will place a common formula very soon," she said at the crowded press conference held at the party's Dhanmondi office.

Brushing aside Prime Minister Khaleda Zia's allegation that AL is conspiring to foil the next general election by boycotting it in the name of reforms of caretaker government system, Hasina said, "Awami League doesn't believe in any conspiracy."

"We believe people's verdict is the only way to go to power," she said putting a counter allegation that the BNP-led government has planned to rig the next general election through 'election engineer-

"Sensing defeat in the next election, the ruling BNP has planned to snatch people's verdict," said the opposition leader. "They are going to appoint a party man as the caretaker government chief." she added.

The former prime minister urged the people to resist any move of BNP to rig the polls

Asked about the prime minis-

ter's rigid stance against the electoral reforms, Hasina said. "Khaleda Zia made similar statements during the 1996 movement Kibria and she realised what is caretaker

government after a mass upsurge." "This time too she will learn what reforms are ... She has no way to escape without bringing reforms (in the caretaker government system)," said the AL chief.

The opposition leader said even the alliance partners of BNP are now saying that BNP is harbouring religious militants and has failed to govern the country.

Refuting another allegation of the prime minister that the opposition parties are tarnishing Bangladesh's image in the international arena, Hasina said, "It is not the opposition, this government is enough to tarnish country's image abroad.

"Even the government has used the national news agency to spread propaganda against my son, also involving a neighbouring country's defence minister," she said referring to a BSS report that claimed her son Sajib Wajed Joy has recently met Indian Defence Minister Pranab Mukherjee in New

Delhi which the Indian government has denied. "Doesn't it tarnish the country's image?" she posed a question.

The opposition leader said the government has also blackened the country's name by issuing a false statement following a joint letter of three influential US senators on the inquiry of the killing of former finance minister Shah AMS

"The government claimed FBI is investigating the Kibria killing case, but the US embassy categorically denied this. Doesn't it damage our mage?" she said.

The AL president accused the BNP leaders of using money from the government exchequer to organise party's union level councils

She demanded the new pay scale for government employees be effected from the year 2002, when the prime minister and her cabinet colleagues increased their remuneration showing the reason of price hike of essentials.

Hasina was awarded the Congressional Medal of Achievement from the Philippines House of Representatives while participating at a meeting of the Association of Asian Parliamentarians for Peace in Manila

She also attended an international conference on terrorism and democracy in Madrid and later went to Florida, USA, for treatment of her hearing debility caused by last year's grenade attack on her meeting in Dhaka.

Senior leaders of the party were

present at the press conference.

KIBRIA KILLING 'My husband is a victim of conspiracy'

Says Quiyyum's wife

Wife of AKM Abdul Quiyyum, the prime accused in Shah AMS Kibria killing case, yesterday said that her husband is 'a victim of conspiracy by some vested interest groups'.

Quivvum's wife Suraiva Afroza in a statement yesterday also said that Quiyyum is being deprived of his 'constitutional rights to prove that the allegations against him are false and outcome of a conspiracy'.

She alleged that an influential quarter envying her husband's popularity among the Habiganj locals has falsely implicated him in the murder of Kibria.

"We too want the real culprits in Kibria slaying to be brought to iustice," she said adding, "But an innocent man like Quiyyum should not be made fall guy for the murder.'

Describing her husband as a pious and honest man, she said he always respected Kibria as a person, and went to see him [Kibria] in the hospital and attended his namaz-e-janaza.
