The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has advised the government to go for contractionary monetary policy to keep inflation, credit growth and foreign exchange reserves under control.

Bangladesh economy is now facing the pressure of rising inflation and soaring oil prices. The revenue collection is also falling short of target. So, the country should go for a contractionary policy to stave off internal and external shocks, the IMF advisor said.

Asked if the policy puts brake on tempo of industrialisation in the country, Weerasinghe said it will reduce value of credit flow when there is high inflation. So, the economy needs a balancing act. "And it is an act of striking a balance."

He said the combination of risks arising from devastating floods, expiry of multi-fibre arrangement and sustained high energy and commodity prices have led the mission to adjust its projections of growth to 5.2 percent and inflation to 6.5 percent for FY2004-05.

Regarding IMF's suggestion on

new pay scale, the IMF official said the pay scale should be implemented gradually in three stages in a period of three years to avoid any sudden impact on budget.

"Besides revenue shortfall, the country's economy now bears the pressure of MFA phase-out on readymade garment export. I think people will understand the situation," he hoped.

Weerasinghe said the government needs to go for structural reforms in public administration in tandem with the new pay scale. There should be an incentive programme to retain skilled personnel in civil administration.

He said the mission will place its review to the IMF Executive Board in June for release of fourth tranche of poverty reduction growth facility (PRGF) amounting to \$80 million.

Banks now allowed to declassify bad loans

In a bid to ease workload and decentralise responsibilities, the central bank has allowed the banks to declassify bad loan cases without its prior approval.

Before making classified loan accounts regular, the banks will now need approval from their respective boards following the Bangladesh Bank guidelines, said a central bank circular Thursday.

Before placing these cases to the bank boards, the managing directors and the branch managers of the banks concerned have to certify

approval for the declassification, the banks should report those to the department concerned of the central bank within 15 days. The central bank will verify the loan accounts on case-to-case basis.

"If there are any irregularities in declassifying the loans, the central bank will take action against such activities," the circular said.

The banks could not declassify loan accounts before this order in accordance with the central bank's earlier issued directive on December 6, 1998, which restricted the banks to do so.

Earlier, classification of loan

After the board of directors' accounts by the central bankinspec tion team was final and the banks were not allowed to declassify the loan accounts without the approval of the central bank.

"The latest order will help the central bank to ease its workload as the banks and officials concerned are now responsible to declassify loan accounts," said a top official of the central bank.

RMG buyers must recognise limitations of local units

Commerce minister says

Commerce Minister Altaf Hossain Choudhury yesterday said foreign buyers of Bangladeshi readymade garments (RMG) must recognise the limitations of local business and should not expect too high a standard of the products.

"Our buyers should not demand standards which are too high for producers in a country like Bangladesh," he observed while speaking as chief guest at the inaugural session of a roundtable on 'Social and Ecological Standards in the RMG Industry' in Dhaka.

The German Development Cooperation (GTZ), supported by the German Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and the Foreign Trade Association of German Retailers (AVE), sponsored the roundtable with private sector, business organisations, civil society and the government of Bangladesh.

Professor Wahiduddin Mahmud

delivered the keynote paper at the standard," he hoped.

Regarding high demands of the buyers, the commerce minister said the socio-economic realities of a least developed country (LDC) like Bangladesh should be considered before asking for compliance with such standards.

He pointed various steps taken by the government to make the RMG sector competitive in the post-MFA

Altaf also said BGMEA (Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association) drafted a 'Code of Conduct' last year, which is currently being discussed to finalise in the Tripartite Consultative Committee (TTC) involving the Ministry of Labour and Employment and various union and employers' organisations."Once the code is accepted in the TCC, we believe, the RMG factories will comply with the code and the buyers will recognise the code as a social

In the keynote paper, Mahmud said there are grey areas regarding what should be "reasonable" working conditions or a minimum wage.

"These depend on a country's prevailing socio-economic conditions. Surely, one should not judge our standards by the standards of the rich countries," he said.

Blaming the double standard stance of the government regarding labour standards, Mahmud said, "Being a signatory to the international conventions on labour standards and human rights, we have implemented them only halfheartedly or not at all. We have thus created opportunities for the outsiders to dictate business code to us through the leverage of international trade."

Hans-Peter Portrykus, AVE Coordinator Bangladesh and Gerd Luuers of GTZ also spoke at the
