## Another suspect on remand

Another suspect arrested in connection with the killing of a school headmistress, was placed on a five-day remand yesterday.

Uttara police arrested Abul Hasan, 20, son of Jamsar Ali, from his residence at Rajabari in the city's Uttara area on Monday and produced him before the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court, Dhaka yesterday.

Police also prayed for a ten-day remand for the arrestee. The investigation officer (IO) in his prayer said Hasan, accomplice of another arrestee Ibrahim on the same charge, might be involved in the killing. He needs to be quizzed to find out the whereabouts of

others involved in the incident, the IO said.

After hearing, Metropolitan Magistrate Jagannath Das Khokan placed Hasan on a five-day remand.

Shahnaz Kabir Lily, 35, headmistress of Ashuliya Government Primary School, was stabbed to death by a gang of robbers at her Kamarpara house in Uttara on Sunday morning.

Uttara police also arrested five other youths -- Ibrahim alias Emu, 24, Abdur Rashed, 20, Md Sharif, 20, Rabiul Islam, 24, and Abdur Rahim, 20, -- on Sunday and took four of them except Abdur Rahim on a five-day remand for interrogation.

## 1 gets life for raping child

A court here yesterday awarded life term rigorous imprisonment to one person for raping a five-year-old girl in 1999.

Judge Md Nurul Islam of Chittagong Woman and Child Repression Control Tribunal-3 handed the punishment to Ujjal Shil, 22, the lone accused, for raping a Class-1 student of Parigram village under Patiya upazila of the district on July 13.

According to prosecution, Ujjal took the girl on the rooftop of his building and violated her at around 12.30pm.

The victim fell seriously sick following profuse bleeding and was admitted to a hospital.

Her mother filed a case with the Patiya Police Station accusing Ujjal.

Sub Inspector Abdur Rab pressed the chargesheet and sent the case to Tribunal-3. Nine prosecution witnesses were cross-examined during the trial.

Public Prosecutor Advocate Abdus Sattar and Advocate Tushar Chanda defended the plaintiff while human rights lawyers Zia Habib Ahsan, Sharif Uddin and Sunil Sarker assisted them.

Advocate Abdus Salam Anwari took the defendant's side.

## Main accused in Kibria murder produced in court

Abdul Quayyum, the main accused in the Shah AMS Kibria murder case, and three others were produced in the Cognizance Court-1 here yesterday in another murder case.

The three others are Jamir Ali, Joynal Abedin Momin and Joynal Abedin Jalal.

The next date of hearing of the case is April 30.

The four were taken on remand several times in connection with the murder of former finance minister Shah AMS Kibria.

Kibria was killed in a grenade attack at Boiddyer Bazar in the district on January 27.
