Govt decides to award VIP status to 30 top taxpayers

BDNEWS, Dhaka

The government has decided to select 30 top individual taxpayers in three categories to confer them with the prestigious status of very important person (VIP) from the

"We have finalised the decision at an inter-ministerial meeting today," said National Board of Revenue (NBR) Chairman Khairuzzman Chowdhury yester-

According to NBR sources, the country currently has nearly 1.7 million individual taxpayers, a jump by 300,000 from the previous

Initially, some 30 persons equally divided into three categories- exporters, importers and nonresident Bangladeshis - will be awarded the VIP status on the basis of highest payment of tax, the NBR chairman said.

NBR sources said the VIP taxpayers will be given a card which will be valid for one fiscal year.

The government will give a number of incentives to these taxpayers, including easy access to bank loan and priority in import and export trade, sources said.

The meeting was presided over by NBR chairman Khairuzzman Chowdhury and attended by officials of the Cabinet Division, finance, home and foreign ministries and Board of Investment.

Bangladesh Bank has relaxed rules for rescheduling defaulted loans stemming from stocklot in readymade garment sector.

In a circular issued yesterday, the central bank instructed the commercial banks to give a chance to apparel exporters to reschedule loans if the exporters deposit the amount they get from sale of

The exporters will not be required to pay any down payment o get their defaulted loans rescheduled on depositing amounts from the sold stocklot. The rescheduling without down payment will be made on the basis of bank-client relationhip, the BB circular said.

Earlier this month, the central bank reduced the credit limit including various loan facilities (funded and non-funded) to 35 percent of the total capital from existing 50 percent. The cash loan (funded) of a commercial bank cannot exceed 15 percent of the bank's total capital.

According to the earlier circular, the banks will have to take steps to bring down the loan amounts of the already disbursed loans exceeding the new limit by June 30, 2005 and the term loans by June, 2006.

BB to adopt performance based promotion policy for staff

Bangladesh Bank (BB) yesterday decided to change promotion policy for the central bank's officials as well as regularising the job of daily wagebased employees.

A board meeting of the central bank made the decision chaired by outgoing BB Governor Dr

Fakhruddin Ahmed. The term of Dr Fakhruddin Ahmed will expire on April 30. Just before his departure, the meeting took the decision of adopting a new human resource and promotion policy for the BB officials.

"This revised promotion policy is merit-based one that will help increase efficiency and capacity of BB,' said a high BB official.

He said newly adopted policy is tighter and more performancebased compared to flexibility of previous policy. Besides, the meeting also decided to regularise the jobs of the daily wage-based employees, he said.

Meanwhile, ahead of the gover-nor's departure, the Bangladesh Association of Banks (BAB) also met with Fakhruddin Ahmed yesterday in a farewell meet. The successor of Fakhruddin is yet to be announced.

Electronic recharge system for GP phones from today

NBR may offer duty waiver for knitwear machinery

The National Board of Revenue (NBR) yesterday said it may consider waiving all duties on imported knitwear machinery in the next budget for the growth of the indus-

> NBR Chairman Khairuzzaman Chowdhury made the disclosure at a pre-budget discussion with Bangladesh Knitwear Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BKMEA) yesterday in

> At present, 7.5 to 25 percent duties are imposed on different imported machinery used in knitwear industry.

The BKMEA leaders also demanded proper implementation of VAT relief on the utility bills of export- oriented knitwear industry, exempting them from BTMA (Bangladesh Textile Mills Association) certificate for cash incentive and

continuing tax holiday for next five

They also urged the NBR chief to extend validity of bond licence from one year to three years and change law for issuing bond licence on the basis of composite factory.

BKMEA leaders said owners of knitwear industry find it difficult to meet the criteria of composite factory set by the NBR. Composite factory involves all manufacturing activities in a single factory.

Bond licence is a special permission of the government to import all duty-free raw materials for the export-oriented apparel industry.

However, the NBR chairman blasted the BKMEA leaders for the demand of changing law for issuing

"You are violating the composite factory definition by doing knit work from other factory, you are doing trading rather than manufacturing, he told the BKMEA leaders.

Khairuzzaman, however, agreed with the BKMEA leaders to waive VAT from the utility bills of exportoriented knitwear industry and approve transaction of an exporter with two banks.

He also ordered high-ups of the NBR to make change with the date counting system of bond licence.

At present, time schedule of bond licence starts from March 31. From now on NBR will start counting year of bond licence from the date of issue.

NBR chief also promised the BKMEA leaders that from now on they would not need any certificate from BTMA for their business activi-

Emirates Group posts 49pc net profit

When the airline industry is struggling in the changed global economic scenario, the Emirates Group posted a record 49 percent net profit in the financial year ending on 31 March, 2005.

The Group's revenue totalled US\$4.9 billion in FY2004-05, marking a 36 percent rise over the previ-

"We have had yet another suc-cessful year for the company and the 17th consecutive profitable one for the airline. Our customers are the pillar of Emirates' good fortune," Emirates Chairman Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed Al-Moktoum announced at a news conference at Jumeirah Beach Hotel in Dubai yesterday.

The Group's sharp sales growth and record returns rode on customers' increasing preference for its products, as illustrated by the 2.1 million more passengers who flew Emirates in the latest financial year, for a new record total of 12.5 million.

"We are gratified at the strong financial results of the Group. The rapid growth Emirates business model requires a high rate of return to sustain our enormous investments in people, advanced equipment and facilities, as well as in IT and other support services," Al-Moktoum added. He also commented on how the

industry, already struggling with continually changing global economic conditions, had been further impacted by a dramatic rise in jet At Emirates, fuel costs rose to 21

percent of the total operating expenditure from last year's percent and became the airline's top expenditure, from a distant second in 2003-04.

Measures taken by the Group to remain on target included severe cost-cutting steps such as recruitment freeze, expect for Flight Deck, cabin crew and engineering staff. In addition Emirates, like other air-lines, was also forced to increase fuel surcharges on tickets, which did not

fully coverthe escalating costs.
Al-Moktoum described the abnormal jet fuel price hike as the most formidable challenge faced by Emirates, and the single largest threat to the achievement of the Group's financial goals in the current financial year.

With the addition of nine new aircraft during the financial year, Emirates's fleet count reached 75 at the end of March.

As before, after paying a fair dividend to the Group's ownership and rewarding the employees with a well-deserved bonus, Emirates will plough its healthy profits right back into the business to keep its airline and travel-related group of companies competitive, and to keep treating its customers in the manner they have come to expect from Emirates, Al-Moktoum explained.

Emirates Group comprises of Emirates Airline, Dnata and subsidiary companies. Dnata includes Dnata Airport Operations as sole operator at Dubai International Airport and Dnata Agencies, the largest travel agency in the Middle

Huge textile export to spur China's cotton import low prices make farmers turn to REUTERS, Beijing

Growing Chinese textile exports and expectations of a lower domestic harvest could spur China, the world's top cotton consumer, to import over 3 million tonnes of cotton in 2005/2006, industry officials said.

But so far this marketing year, which runs through September, imports have disappointed expectations as domestic mills work through stockpiles built up in 2004. The value of Chinese textile

exports rose 30 per cent in the first two months of 2005 to \$14.5 billion, following the end of a quota regime that limited Chinese textile access to European and North American markets. That growth could boost China's

cotton demand in 2005/2006 to 8.8 million tonnes, a rise of 500,000 tonnes from forecast demand in 2004/2005, Shi Jianwei, president of China National Cotton Exchange, said. Chinese farmers are growing

less cotton this year, as last year's

other crops like wheat. Planted acreage is estimated to be at least 10 percent lower than last year. Domestic output was seen at 5.7 million tonnes in 2005/2006, com-

pared with 6.32 million tonnes a year earlier, if there is no major weather damage, said Shi. So far this year, imports have lagged their expected volume, traders said. Chinese importers

rushed to buy at high prices in 2004 and were then surprised when a bumper harvest pushed prices down, leaving them more cautious about buying this year. Chinese cotton imports totalled about 500,000 tonnes from September through March 2005.

Cotton imports reached 1.98 mil-

lion tonnes in the 2003/2004 sea-

Beijing had not yet allocated 1 million tonnes of new import quotas to textile mills, traders said. Importers are still working through 894,000 tonnes issued in January.
