# Spend funds by May to get enhanced allocation

*More funds for BADC in next budget likely*

UNB, Dhaka

The next budget is likely to allocate more funds for strengthening Bangladesh Agricultural Development Corporation (BADC) and other agricultural research institutions to help produce high-yielding variety (HYV) of seeds to increase agriculture output.

"BADC seeds are in demand among the farmers." Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman told reporters after a pre-budget meeting with eight ministries, including agriculture, at the ministry yesterday.

Presently, the BADC supply only five percent of the total seed demand while the rest comes mainly from household stocks of the farmers. Agriculture Ministry officials said. Imported seeds also meet some demand, though marginally.



## Samad Azad's qukhwani tomorrow

Qukhwani of former Foreign Minister and Awami League leader Abdus Samad Azad will be held at his Lake Circus residence in the city after Asr prayers tomorrow.

Party leaders and workers, relatives and admirers have been requested to attend the qukhwani.

Saifur asked the ministries to spend funds allocated under the current budget by the month of May to get enhanced allocation in the next budget.

Other ministries at the meeting were Social Welfare, Women and Children Affairs, Foreign Affairs,

Fisheries and Livestock, LGRD and Cooperatives, Water Resources and Power.

Saifur said that the coming budget would be formulated with a caring attitude for the distressed population, including the elderly, the retarded ones and widows.

## FALSE ARMS CASE

# Court asks IGP, DMP commissioner to take action against IO

A Dhaka Court yesterday directed the Inspector General of Police (IGP) and the Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) Commissioner to take departmental action against a sub-inspector (SI) of Uttara Police Station for filing a false case.

Judge Mohammad Golam Mortuza Mozumder of the Speedy Trial Tribunal-2 issued the order as Mohammad Rawshan Alam, complainant and investigation officer (IO) of an arms case, filed it against a fabric trader Sayem Dewan Chanchal.

The court also acquitted the accused as the charges brought against him were not proved. The court directed the accused to seek remedies from the competent authorities in accordance with the civil and criminal laws.

In his order, the court mentioned that the prosecution hopelessly failed to prove and establish the charges leveled against the accused. The charges against the accused have been brought upon falsehood, concoction and fabrication. The SI had done it to gain something from others and to evict Chanchal from his rented shop at 29 Kushal Centre at Uttara. So the accused is acquitted, the court added.

In the case filed with Uttara police Station, it was alleged that at about 6:30pm on June 21 last year SI Rawshan Alam and his forces raided Chanchal's rented house at Uttara in the

city, recovered a revolver with 4 bullets from under his mattress and arrested him. Later, an arms case was filed in this connection. The SI investigated the case and pressed charge against Chanchal on July 3 last year showing 10 people as prosecution witnesses.

The case was then transferred to the two tribunals, including the present court for its trial.

Nine prosecution witnesses, including SI Rawshan Alam were produced before the court for giving their statements. But no witness could bring real allegations against the accused.

On the other hand, it was proved that the SI brought it against him only to evict Chanchal from his rented shop at 29 Kushal Centre at Uttara in collusion with his landlord one Kamal.

The court mentioned that the prosecution hopelessly failed to prove and establish the charges leveled against the accused. The charges against the accused have been brought upon falsehood, concoction and fabrication. The SI had done it to gain something from others and to evict Chanchal from his rented shop at 29 Kushal Centre at Uttara. So the accused is acquitted, the court added.

In his order, the court mentioned that the prosecution hopelessly failed to prove and establish the charges leveled against the accused. The charges against the accused have been brought upon falsehood, concoction and fabrication. # Foil evil designs of damaging country's image, stability

## PM urges all patriotic forces

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday urged all patriotic forces to foil evil designs of damaging country's image, stability and peace.

"If stability, social peace and image are alright, then production, development, investment, industrialisation and employment opportunity will increase," she said.

The PM was inaugurating a two-day programme in observance of the historic May Day organised by the Ministry of Labour and Employment at the Osmani Memorial Auditorium yesterday.

She announced a number of welfare schemes for the workers.

Presided over by State Minister for Labour and Employment Amanullah Aman, the function was also

addressed by ILO Director Gopal Bhattacharya, Bangladesh Employers Federation President M

Anis-Ud-Dowla, Bangladesh Jatiyatabdhi Sramik Dal General Secretary M Zafurul Hasan, Secretary for

Labour and Employment M Shafiqul Islam and Labour Director M Aminul Islam.

The speakers at the function recalled with gratitude the sacrifice of the workers 119 years ago in the United States to establish their right of working not more than eight hours a day.

This year's theme of the May Day is "Labour-owner Amity is Development in Production".

Khaleda said that real development of the country is not possible without protecting the interest and ensuring welfare of the workforce.

Recalling the post-independence nationalisation of mills and factories, she regretted that the

beginning of Bangladesh was not very pleasant.

"Widespread looting and politicisation in the name of a special ideology marked the post-independence period," she said.

She reminded that the opportunists and even some dishonest labour leaders made the most in the plunder, depriving the labourers. The doldrums rendered the nationalised mills and factories losing and sick concerns.

"The loss has come down as a burden on the shoulders of the country and nation ... the larger section of population is bearing the brunt of the loss."

She said her government is committed to ensuring welfare of the workers and has taken up a number of measures, including a plan to form a national wage and productivity commission.

Work on the formation of Labour Welfare Foundation for all

labour organisations is under active consideration of the government, she announced at the May Day meet.

She said that a new policy for empowerment of women workforce is being formulated and would be implemented soon.

Khaleda said Bangladesh has signed 33 ILO conventions and taken up various programmes to implement them.

She reminded that the workforce is the main resource working in the fields, factories, offices, shops, business establishments, mines, gardens and transport sectors.

"Dignity of labour has to be enhanced to improve the image of the country," she said lauding the workers for contributing to the

development of the country as well as for strengthening the economy.

Workforce is the architect of the world civilisation and advancement, she noted. "With advances in technology, machines have taken over, but still the person manning the machine is the driving force for development, production and construction."

The PM emphasised proper training of the labour force for improvement of their skill and for enhancing production.

The second session of the May Day's inaugural function included a musical function participated by noted artistes Arif Dewan, Kajal Dewan, Shakila Zafar and Kanak Chapa.



## Kibria's 74th anniversary of birth today

Today is the 74th birth anniversary of late Shah AMS Kibria, former finance minister and a member of the Awami League Advisory Council.

Kibria was born on May 1, 1931 at Jalaisab village in Nabiganj upazila of Habiganj District.

The family members will place wreaths at his grave at the Banani graveyard in the morning and offer fataha.

Various organisations, including Sonar Bangla Jubo Parishad, Bangladesh Foundation for Development Research and Bangabandhu Smriti Charcha Kendra, have drawn up programmes to mark the day.

The Bangladesh Foundation for Development Research and the Weekly Mridubhawan will organise a seminar on Kibria's last article on 'Reforms of Caretaker Government' at the CIRDAP auditorium on May 9. Prof Kabir Chowdhury, chair of the Foundation, will preside over the seminar.

Kibria was killed in a grenade attack at Boidyer Bazar in Habiganj on January 27.
