Observers see fake votes, intimidation in some centres

The election monitoring organisations have found some incidents of irregularities in the Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) polls held yesterday amid tight security although the Election Commission claimed the

The monitoring groups in their preliminary reports after the polls said fake votes were cast and minority voters were intimidated in some areas but the law-enforcers did not take adequate steps to prevent fake

They, however, said the polls were held peacefully amid a few sporadic incidents of violence. The monitoring groups will release their detailed reports today in separate press conferences in Dhaka.

After inspecting 130 polling centres, Jatiya Nirbachon Porjobekkhon Parishad (Janipop) and US- based polls monitoring organisation International Republic Institute (IRI) said they watched voting in 130 polling stations and witnessed a 'disturbing amount of false voting and vote selling'

Mohiuddin heads for win CEC terms it fair, top rivals claim rigging

Results declaration resumes after thousands of his supporters lay siege to RO's office; Circuit House attacked

Opposition-backed mayoral candidate ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury is set for a third term in office in yesterday's Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) polls, leading by a wide margin against his main challenger Mir Mohammad Nasir Uddin.

Mohiuddin was leading with 204,437 votes in 338 out of the 577 centres, with his nearest rival ruling alliance-supported candidate Mir Nasir trailing with 142,491 votes when the last report came at 3:00am.

Thousands of enthusiastic people took to the streets to celebrate what appeared like a certain victory for Mohiuddin. They danced, honked horns, hugged each other, chanted slogans and flashed V-signs in raucous celebrations.

"People have foiled all conspiracies to snatch the election results, said Nagorik Committee candidate Mohiuddin late last night, referring to the initial delay in the announcement of the election results.

Awami League (AL) supporters thronged the office of the Returning Officer (RO) in the port city after announcement of election results suddenly stopped at around 9:30pm. The results announcement stopped as Mir Nasir's polling agents refused to sign result sheets.

The RO's office resumed announcing the results at 10:30pm following tremendous pressure from the AL leaders and supporters who laid siege to the office. Mohiuddin himself headed the

Mohiuddin's supporters vandalised Chittagong Circuit House, said sources in the police who were standing helplessly.

The Election Commission (EC) was clearly annoyed with the pause in the results announcement. EC officials in Dhaka repeatedly phoned the RO to know the reason for the silence.

After the mostly peaceful elections, Mohiuddin's supporters brought out victory processions at SEE PAGE 15 COL 1

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) MA Syed yesterday said that Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) polls were fair while both the opposition and ruling alliance camps complained of electoral irregulari-

After the polling ended, the opposition-backed Nagorik Committee brought allegations of vote rigging in at least 84 polling centres while BNP-led four-party alliance's mayoral candidate in 71 centres. The EC however expressed satisfaction with the overall polling.

"Voting was not suspended at any of the centres and it proves that the polls were held peacefully," the CEC told journalists after completion of the polling yesterday after-

Election Commissioner AK Mohammad Ali described the elections as acceptable

"Experienced election observers were there and so far they have not filed any complaint," he told reporters at his office.

Leaders of the mainstream opposition parties met the CEC at noon and lodged complaints of irregularities at different polling stations. The Nagorik Committee-backed

Chowdhury by fax lodged complaints of electoral irregularities with the EC at noon. He alleged that the ruling alliance men captured 36 polling centres shortly after the voting had kicked off.

Gono Forum President Dr Kamal Hossain and Awami League (AL) General Secretary Abdul Jalil in the meeting with MA Syed complained that ruling alliance men seized a number of polling centres across the port city and cast fake votes. Local police administration did

not discharge their duties, and thus failed to contain irregularities during the polls. Minority voters were intimidated while a large number of outsiders cast fake votes in favour of the ruling alliance candidate, they Dr Kamal at the meeting

demanded the EC immediately redress those complaints of irregular Prior to meeting the CEC, Al

General Secretary Abdul Jalil told reporters that ministers positioned at different polling centres were using walkie-talkies to co-ordinate the 'vote rigging'. "Such activities could easily change the polling results," he observed.

the announcement of election results spread in the port city at around 10:00 last night, thousands of people laid a siege to the returning officer's (RO) temporary office housed in the Gymnasium Complex of MAAziz Stadium. The entire area turned into a sea

of humanity immediately as thousands more joined the gathering from far and wide of the city in small processions and shouted slogans in favour of mayoral aspirant ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury.

They also took a vow to resist any attempt to manipulate the election results.

Mohiuddin, who was leading in

addressed the people and warned of dire consequences if ruling coalition-backed candidate Mir Mohammad Nasir Uddin snatched victory from through a behind-thescenes conspiracy Frontline opposition Awami

League leaders, present in the city to canvass for Mohiuddin and monitor the high-profile polls, also joined the gathering and threatened to launch a movement to bring down the government if the election results were manipulated.

"I came here because I heard that the government officials were not declaring the election results though Mohiuddin was leading by over two lakh votes," said Ismail Hossain, an elderly citizen of city's Noor Ahmed Road, near Kazir
