

No more wars, cold or real one, vows Putin

'US should practice what it preaches on democracy'

Russian President Vladimir Putin vowed yesterday to help ensure the world never again faces a global conflict, whether a Cold War or a real war, as world leaders gathered to commemorate the end of World War II in Europe.

hailed reconciliation between Russia and Germany as "one of the most important post-war achievements" in Europe. German Chancellor Gerhard Schroeder was also among participants at the parade.

Two GIs, 23 militants killed in Afghan fighting

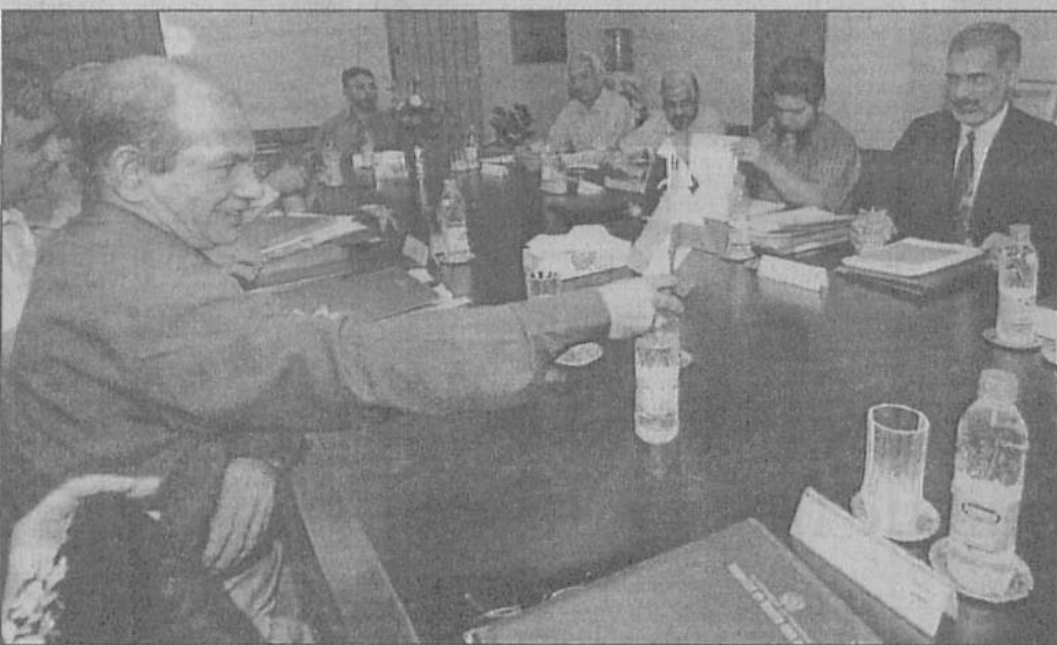
