The Indian government ordered a new probe yesterday into the socalled "Tehelka scam" in which top politicians and army brass were secretly filmed apparently taking bribes from reporters posing as arms dealers.

The Congress-backed government threw out a 41-page report of an inquiry by judge S.N. Phukan into the 2001 incident that had been ordered by the previous Hindu nationalist-led Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government of Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee, saying it was "not complete". The order for the new inquiry

followed sensational footage shot on March 13, 2001 that nearly brought down the government and rocked the military establishment. The videotape showed 31 national politicians, bureaucrats and top defence officers allegedly accepting money from fake arms dealers. The sting operation was carried

out by upstart news site www.tehelka.com, which now functions as an investigative weekly government-paid pilgrimage aboard a military plane in what critics said broadsheet.

A government spokesman said the allegations that those filmed took bribes were being handed to the national police agency, the Central Bureau of Investigation, for a full investigation.

"The (Phukan) commission has given its report only on two of the terms of reference instead of the four made to it, and so it is not complete and therefore the government has rejected it," the government spokesman said. The BJP government-ordered inquiry finished its probe in October

KEPZ sources said they plan to set up a whole range of garments and textiles units plus electronics, software, scientific and optical tools, machine tools, automotive parts and other units there. To set up its infrastructure, Youngone will separately invest \$200 million.

PMO sources said that following recent press reports on the KEPZ and Finance Minister M Saifu Rahman's visit to South Korea in late March, the issue has been revived.

During his visit to Seoul in connection with an international seminar, Saifur met the Korean finance minister who inquired about the status of the KEPZ. Saifur told him that he would discuss the matter with the prime minister soon, and he did it after his return home.

Since early 2002, the PMO formed several committees to look into irregularities in the KEPZ and the Private EPZ Act framed during the AL rule. The first committee verbally asked the KEPZ why needed an area as huge as 2,500 acres and hinted that it could do away with 500 acres.

Finally in November 2003, a high-powered committee headed by the principal secretary recommended that there is no need to change the Private EPZ Act and said. "in the interest of national image and foreign investment," the KEPZ should be allowed to function without anv delav.

No follow-up action was however taken. "But considering the prospect of KEPZ to bring in huge foreign direct investment, and relationship with Korea, the prime minister is now agreeable to awarding the licence," a PMO source said.

The PM heads a Board Governors to deal with private EPZ licensing under the Private EPZAct. The board last met in April 2003.

The country's government-run five EPZs have 203 units with a total nvestment of 748 million dollars.

The country's first EPZ set up in Chittagong in 1983 has 119 industrial units on a 453-acre site. The Dhaka EPZ set up in 1993 has 72 units on 355 acres. The other EPZs

set up after 2001 have only a few units -- the 191-acre Mongla EPZ has five units, 258 -acre Comilla EPZ six units and 233-acre Syedpur FPZ only one unit.

Youngone dominates these five EPZs with 25 percent of the total its 16 units investment and employing more than 30,000 people and exporting goods worth over \$220 million.

"To tackle the situation," Hague said, "a taskforce with representations from BIWTA, navy, coastquard, local administration and the police should be formed immediately.

When contacted, a high official at the shipping ministry said they are concerned about the problem and have asked the local administrations to take stern action against those involved in the malpractice.

"Due to budgetary constraints," he said, "the shipping ministry is unable to solve many of its problems including the pilferage of navigational aids."
