



"I am here to create a platform and an environment for our players to perform. My long-term goal is to ultimately become the best in the world," he said.

India on Thursday began interviews for the next cricket coach amid unprecedented media frenzy on John Wright's likely successor to one of the sport's most high-profile and demanding jobs.

The four candidates --Australians Greg Chappell and Tom Moody, India's Mohinder Amarnath and Desmond Haynes of the West Indies -- will appear separately before a high-powered selection panel of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) at a local

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has suggested that it will seek legal opinion over the six-match ban imposed on Sourav Ganguly for India's slow over-rates in the one-day series against Pakistan.

"We are getting the issue legally examined," Ranbir Singh Mahendra, the BCCI president, was quoted by Indo-Asian News Service. "We will do as our counsels advise."

Ganguly was handed the ban by Chris Broad, the match referee, after India fell behind in the over-

rates during two consecutive matches of the one-day series, at Jamshedpur and at Ahmedabad.

He then lost his appeal against the verdict when Michael Beloff, the ICC appeals commissioner, ruled that Broad's decision was justified. Ganguly missed the last two games of the series, and will miss most of the triangular tournament in Sri Lanka in August if the decision
