BCB to think over ZC's proposal

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) admitted that it has received a proposal from Zimbabwe Cricket (ZC) to play a series that falls outside of the International Cricket Council (ICC) calendar.

"We have got the proposal but it has yet to be settled. We have to discuss everything with our team management before finalising the tour," said BCB advisor and media committee chairman Reazuddin Al-Mamun yesterday

A media report told on Friday that the ZC is anxious to play the Tigers again at the beginning of the next year to prove that their recent series defeat against Bangladesh belied on their internal problems.

The nine-member committee includes former players Roshan Mahanama, Ranjan Madugalle, Duleep Mendis, Bandula Warnapura, Graeme Labrooy, Sidat Wettimuny, Michael Tissera and Anura Tennekoon

Cricket in Sri Lanka is on the ropes after claims of financial mismanagement saw the existing board replaced with the interim committee.

"We are in a financial mess and the committee will look into ways to improve cricket in Sri Lanka," said Ranatunga, who is also the country's deputv tourism minister.

'Sri Lanka lost to Bangladesh in a unior cricket match recently and this shows that the standard has to be

The talent is not harnessed properly. There are several issues in Sri Lankan cricket which has to be addressed including the domestic cricket which is suffering from a lack of proper direction.'

Ranatunga, also the new Sri Lankan representative on the influential ICC Cricket Committee, said the national squad must be selected with one eye on the 2007 World Cup.

"We have to build a strong side including talented junior players and the process has to start now.

Ranatunga played in Sri Lanka's inaugural Test against England in 1982 aged 18, led the team to World Cup glory in 1996 and quit cricket five

He has not been involved in the game for the last five years, although he made an unsuccessful bid to win the post of the board president two

Sri Lanka will play against two Test matches against West Indies at home in July followed by a triangular one-day series also including India in August.

Chappell welcomed

Greg Chappell will get about Rs one crore per year as the coach of Indian cricket team under the terms of his two-vear contract and his choice for the post has been widely welcomed

by former Indian Test players.
The Board of Control for Cricket India (BCCI), the world's richest cricket body, will pay 56-year-old Chappell an annual remuneration of 175,000 US dollars (Rs 78 lakh), the same his predecessor John Wright of New Zealand had got, besides allowances and travel expenses,

BCCI sources said. For each day Chappell spends in India, he will get Rs 2,000 per day,

To be based in Bangalore where the Indian National Cricket Academy is located, the Aussie legend will get a 60-day break each year

But there is one sticky point which is yet to be sorted out: that is Chappell's writings for newspaper columns. The issue is likely to be thrashed out between the coach and the Indian board before he takes

charges as the coach on June 15. Several former Indian cricketers

have welcomed Chappell's choice as the coach saying he is fully capable of taking the Indian team, which has slumped into a trough in the last one year, to the next higher level.

According to Gundappa Vishwanath, Chappell's selection should help the team which would benefit from his expertise and experi-Dilip Vengsarkar said that

Chappell is an excellent choice as he

was a great player with a fantastic

international record and tremendous international experience. Another former player Chandu Borde said although he has never played in India that would not be a

handicap because of his sound technique of the game. Arun Lal, Secretary of Indian Cricket Plavers' Association, says Chappell is the right man to carry forward from Wright had left. His

selection would bring a new thought process and ideas into the game. Former wicketkeeper Syed Kirmani said the South Australian is going to be a very useful coach for India because he as the captain of Australia had led from the front and is

He is the kind of man who will stop to answer a query if a youngster walks

Dev was the coach of the Indian cricket team for nearly two years from 1999 to 2000. He opted out of the responsibility after being accused by fellow cricketer Manoj Prabhakhar of being a match-fixer during his time in the game from 1978 to 1994. That decision was also taken because of a lack of support from the BCCI. In 2002, rumours were agog that he would take up the assignment again, but Kapil himself quashed it, saying that if youngsters needed his guidance,
