EU ups pressure on China over textile surge

AFP, Brussels

The European Commission authorised Wednesday urgent EU talks with Beijing over surging Chinese textile imports, the latest step towards imposing limits in an escalating row with the Asian eco-

nomic giant. The European Union's executive arm gave its green light after a request to do so from EU trade commissioner Peter Mandelson concerning two categories of products, T-shirts and flax yarn.

"The commission gave the green light to Mr Mandelson, the (trade) commissioner, to ask for formal consultation with China" on the two types of textile, said spokeswoman

Francoise Le Bail.

Under World Trade Organisation (WTO) rules, China must take "selfrestraint measures" within 15 days of the start of formal talks, which can last a maximum of 90 days.

"If they don't do that then the commission will be able to impose

restraints," Le Bail said. Informal talks between

Mandelson and a Chinese trade negotiator were already under way in Brussels with the aim of reaching an agreement that would make it unnecessary to go ahead with the more formal negotiations.

"We think the atmosphere has been quite constructive," said Mandelson's spokeswoman Claude Veron-Reville.

"As to what's going to happen next... we're flexible. We're prepared to discuss, so discussions will be ongoing throughout the week as necessary," she added.

The threat of a painful legal battle at the WTO is encouraging the two sides to resolve their differences with a negotiated deal.

"Whatever happens, we would obviously very much prefer to find an agreement with the Chinese," Le
