Cops probe bank accounts of Bidisha

Fighter crashes on Wall collapse house, six injured

A training aircraft of Bangladesh Air Force (BAF) yesterday crashed onto a tin-roofed house in Uttara area of the capital, injuring six people including two babies. The lone crew, BAF Flight Lieutenant Ahsanul Kabir, however

The fighter F-7 MB plane crashed due to technical faults at Fayedabad, about five kilometres northeast of Zia International Airport.

As soon as the aircraft crashed at 11:57am a few minutes after takeoff, the one-storey house caught fire.

Three construction workers were killed and two others injured when a basement wall of an underconstruction building on Sonargaon Road in the capital collapsed on them vesterday.

The dead are Ayub Ali, 35, Abul Hossain, 40 and Billal Hossain, 18, fellow workers said.

According to witnesses, a basement wall about 20 feet below the ground level on one side of the planned 22-storey building -- Abdul Momen Finance City Tower -- partly gave in at about noon.

"A group of 21 workers were

dumping sand between a row of piling pillars and temporary brick wall to strengthen them to prevent collapse of earth from the adjacent land during construction. Six of the workers were between the row of pillars and the wall as it collapsed," said Arman, a co-worker.

"Of the six, one managed to escape, two were injured while three were buried under sand, bricks and iron rods," Arman narrated to this correspondent.

About 25 workers instantly tried to dig them out but failed. Eventually, a crane at the construction site removed the pile of sand, SEE PAGE 15 COL 2

Budget size may increase 17pc

Pay, allowance to see significant rise

The upcoming budget may be Tk 63,900 crore in size and this fiscal year's revised budget may be downsized to Tk 55,500 crore from the original Tk57, 248 crore.

Both the income and spending may be increased 16 to 17 percent from the revised budget," said a finance ministry official who preferred to remain unnamed.

Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman is going to propose the national budget in parliament tomorrow for a record 11th time, fourth under the present BNP-

led four-party alliance government The finance ministry is now racing against clock to put final touches to the budget proposal.

Total revenue income for the coming year is going to be raised to Tk 45,720 crore, about 17 percent more than the revised budget, to meet the expenditure.

The budget deficit for the next year may hover around Tk 18,180


Criminals injured four police personnel and snatched away two arrestees at village Chandulia in Kaliganj upazila last night. A police team led by sub-
