Whatmore's demand Bangladesh-Derbyshire 1-dayer today

Bangladesh coach Dav Whatmore wants a kick-start from his boys in the first practice match before they launch their campaign in the triangular one-day series against hosts England at The Oval on June 16.

The 50-year-old Australian also said that every member of his side will get their fair share of opportunity in the two warm-up games including the second match against Worcestershire on June 12 where Pakistan pace demon Shoaib Akhtar is likely to bowl against them.

The team management meanwhile announced the eleven for Friday's game against Derbyshire

with three of the four players, who joined the one-day squad after the Test series was over, getting the chance of much-needed match practice after having little or no training at home.

They are all-rounder Khaled Mahmud, batsman Tushar Imran and paceman Nazmul Hossain. The selectors decided to rest Mohammad Ashraful, young Shahriar Nafees, left-arm spinner Manzarul Islam and paceman Tapash Baisya, who has complained of having pain in his right knee.

Skipper Habibul Bashar will lead the side in the day-night game.

"This is an opportunity to get used to one-day cricket, back to facing the white ball and try to do better than what we did here in September when the ball moved a

bit and we lost lot of wickets early," said Whatmore after appearing in an interview with TransWorld International at the Derby ground.

The Bangladesh coach was understandably not happy with the just concluded Test series that the Tigers lost 2-0 and was also feeling the pinch of a poor showing when Bangladesh came here last September to feature in the ICC Champions Trophy.

"We want to start well whether we bat first or bowl first and it helps things when you start well and that's what we have not done yet," Whatmore said.

Asked how difficult would it be for the four cricketers to adjust to conditions after having no practice at home, Whatmore said that he was

First big match today

The third round of the Premier Football League ends today with Mohammedan Sporting Club taking on Muktijoddha Sangsad in the first big match of the most coveted domestic competition.

The top-of-the-table clash will kick off at 5pm at the Bangabandhu National Stadium.

Both teams have six points from two wins but Muktijoddha, who began the season with more promises, have struggled in the league. Unlike the Reds who edged Dhaka Wanderers 2-1 before unsettling a fiery Arambagh 4-3, Mohammedan won both their matches comfortably.

The Black and Whites, who lost to Muktijoddha twice in two tournaments and failed to reach any of the finals, flourished in the league with their all-local side beating Arambagh 3-1 and Dipali 4-1.

Mohammedan, however, are expected to field their first foreign player in the league today. Having watched seven foreign imports at training, they have finally selected Moroccan midfielder Mohammed Regeragui and Sierra Leone's Donald but only the Moroccan's transfer papers have arrived.

Regeragui's inclusion will give Jashimuddin Joshi -- the third Mohammedan coach this year -- some relief as he will miss two regular players, Faisal Mahmud and Manju, through injury. This match will also be the first of a series of big matches for Mohammedan who play Abahani, Sheikh Russel and Brothers Union next.

His Muktijoddha counterpart Shafiqul Islam Manik also has a new face in Nigerian striker Ernest Jeremiah, who joined the Reds from Kolkata giants East Bengal. He will fill the absence of injured Moni but the Muktis coach was unsure about an immediate impact.

"He has had just one day's practice with us and how he copes with the new team will depend on him. He is a professional and I think it won't be much difficult," commented Manik on the latest arrival.

Bangladesh to face Shoaib

Bangladesh's tour of England is not about to get any easier.

Fresh from being whipped inside three days by England in both their two Tests, the tourists learned on Wednesday that they would come up against Pakistan's Shoaib Akhtar in a one-day match against Worcestershire on Sunday.

It will be the pace bowler's first appearance for the English county and, ominously for Bangladesh, it is being billed as an opportunity for him to demonstrate that Pakistan were wrong to drop him from their Test squad.

"Shoaib has settled in well since arriving last week and this game is an ideal opportunity for him to show everybody how well he is bowling," Worcestershire chief executive Mark Newton said.

If the Bangladesh batsmen are concerned about the prospect of facing one of the fastest bowlers in world cricket, their management are not letting on -- they agreed to let him play although his Worcestershire contract does not officially begin until July 1.

The match against the county is part of Bangladesh's preparation for a one-day triangular series against England and Australia which starts next week.

Argentina book ticket via Brazil

Argentina qualified for the World Cup in the best possible manner on Wednesday, with a 3-1 home win over arch-rivals and world champions Brazil.

Colombia and Chile won home matches for the second time in five days, beating Ecuador 3-0 and

Venezuela 2-1 respectively, to boost their chances of emerging from the 10-nation South American qualifying group.

Meanwhile Paraguay, thumped 4-1 by Brazil on Sunday, reversed the scoreline against Bolivia to stay in contention.

Argentina stunned their opponents in Buenos Aires by rushing to a 3-0 halftime lead with two goals from striker Hernan Crespo, who took his tally in the tournament to seven, and a world-class strike from Juan Roman Riquelme.

Brazil recovered to dominate the second half, pulling one back with a

trademark Roberto Carlos free kick and hitting the post through Adriano in the 84th minute.

Brazil coach Carlos Alberto Parreira said: "Beating Paraguay wasn't paradise, so this isn't hell. Our target is still intact."

Argentina lead the standings with 31 points from 15 games and secured their place in Germany with three matches to play.

Brazil, the only country to have played at all 17 World Cups, are second on 27 and need only three more points to maintain their proud record.

Ecuador (23), Paraguay (22) and

Colombia and Chile (20) appear to be fighting for the other two direct places or fifth spot, which earns a two-leg play-off against the winners of the Oceania region.

Uruguay (18), who drew 0-0 in Peru on Tuesday, still have an outside chance while Peru (15), Venezuela (15) and Bolivia (13) are effectively out of the running.

Brazil paid dearly for a shoddy start when they left Crespo all alone to open the scoring in the fourth minute.

Derby relish Tigers' visit

At the entrance of the Derbyshire County Cricket Club there was an announcement at the notice board -- Visiting Bangladesh team will play a limited-overs game here on 10th June. The game will start under floodlights at 2.30 pm (local time).

And Peter Long, the administrative and facilities manager of the struggling county, was very excited to host Bangladesh for the first time, albeit he knows little about the newest Test nation.

"Is your captain playing in the match and if he is playing it will be a great challenge for our cricketers," said Long, adding that they were expecting a good crowd on Friday.

Long said that the ground witnessed a highest audience of 5,000 during the Twenty20 matches.

Derbyshire cricket ground is like any other beautiful ground in England, but unfortunately it has never staged an official one-day match.

Established in 1870, Derbyshire won the county championship only once and that was in 1936. But Derby, presently struggling at the bottom of the Second Division, enjoyed a relatively better success in limited-overs tournaments.

They won the Gillette Cup, which was the first one-day tournament, in

1969 clinched the Sunday League in 1980, the Benson and Hedges three years later and finish runners-up in the NatWest Challenge trophy in 1998.

Derby might be fielding a side minus a star name with Zimbabwean all-rounder Travis Friend unavailable due to a stress fracture.

Friend said he would have liked to play against Bangladesh after his first game at Dhaka three years ago. He felt that Bangladesh had a better future than Zimbabwe in Test cricket.

Friend said he saw the two-Test series against England and rubbished the claim that Bangladesh should be stripped of their status.

"I have seen a lot of youngsters

coming and playing for Bangladesh but it is missing in Zimbabwe," he said.

Friend was not sure whether he would return and play for Zimbabwe. At the moment he wanted to focus on county cricket. According to him county cricket fine tunes everything and helps someone become a complete cricketer.

The Zimbabwean said Bangladesh cricketers don't have access to play either in domestic competitions in either South Africa or Australia that Zimbabweans have. But they can come to play in county cricket and the Bangladesh cricket authorities should take the initiative.
