KMP alert to extremists' fresh plans

Khulna Metropolitan Police (KMP) have taken tight security measures n the city on intelligence reports that extremists are planning to carry out destructive activities to create panic and political unrest.

Armed cadres of outlawed Purbo Banglar Communist Party (PBCP) and New Biplobi Communist Party (NBCP) who had gone into hiding in the face of Rab operation, have returned to the city in the guise of rickshaw pullers, vegetable and fish vendors, fruit sellers, hawkers and shoe shiners, sources said.

They are holding secret meetngs and getting ready to implement missions as per party decision.

Three top leaders of PBCP (Janajuddho) reportedly used the jeep of an influential political leader for movement during their brief stay in the city and managed to escape a few minutes before plainclothes law enforcers swooped on their hideout, an intelligence report said.

KMP Deputy Commissioner Akbar Ali said they have a strong intelligence network to keep an eye on the movement of the extremists.

US opens criminal probe of 2 army deaths in Iraq

BAGHDAD, Reuters

The US army has opened a criminal investigation into a blast that killed two soldiers at a base in Iraq after discovering it was not caused by an insurgent mortar attack, a military statement said vesterday

It said Captain Phillip Esposito and 1st Lieutenant Louis Allen were killed on Tuesday in an explosion at Forward Operating Base Danger near Saddam Hussein's hometown,

Tikrit.

"The initial investigation by military police responders and military police indicated that a mortar round struck the window on the side of the building where Esposito and Allen were located at the time," the statement

"Upon further examination of the scene by explosive ordnance personnel, it was determined the blast was inconsistent with a mortar attack.'

The military said the soldiers killed were New York National Guard troops assigned to the Headquarters Company of the 42nd Infantry Division. Esposito was company commander and Allen was an operations officer.

The CPD executive director said the share of block allocation increased significantly in the new ADP (annual development programme) from 8 percent in FY05 to 12.4 percent in FY06, which he said goes against the budget disci-

About deficit financing, Debapriya said the ideal approach would be to increase the share of foreign resources in deficit financing, while keeping the loan and bank borrowing at a minimum level respectively for foreign and domes-However, he noted, the existing

scenario is showing a totally opposite trend with high borrowing from banking sources and incremental contributions from foreign loans. This might result in a double jeopardy for the fiscal balance with liquidity crisis and increasing expenditure on interest payments.

Debapriya observed the conciseness of the budget speech this year has reduced the transparency of the budget. In this regard, he pointed out that the finance minister did not mention the tax incidence of various measures and therefore, it is not clear how the income is being redistributed He hailed the measure to net in

more income tax this year, but said it will be politically difficult to implement this.

Talking on fiscal measures, he said the implication of the revised income tax rate for individuals is that people in the high-income brackets will pay relatively less than the lowincome people. He however endorsed other fiscal measures

The CPD felt the tax holiday

provision will have a positive impact. Debapriya said the increase in tax rate for non-listed companies will work against the government's policy of poverty reduction and employment generation since it will affect the small and medium enterprises which do not have the financial footing to be listed on the capital

The CPD hailed the provisions to support the agriculture and export of agricultural produce, but it said a comprehensive initiative to promote export diversification is not seen in the budget. Also absent is any big measure to offset the post-MFA situation

Debapriya said very little has been allocated for power generation, distribution and transmission, which indicates that hardly any substantial improvement in the power situation could be expected in near future

He hailed the measures proposed for leather and RMG/textiles sector, and crop and livestock sectors. But he pointed out that the handloom sub-sector, which supports the poor, did not get any atten-

The CPD budget analysis also said if the implementation behaviour of the proposed budget pursues its earlier track records, then both the fiscal and external balance will be in jeopardy, ultimately undermining the savings-investment prospect.

Analysing the GDP growth track and target of 6.2 percent in FY06, Debapriya said the South Asian region is now in a growth dynamism as reflected in the high growth rates of Pakistan, India and Sri Lanka.

"So it is not a big thing that we will achieve over 6 percent growth." he added. "The major challenge will be how long we can perform like this and whether we can nurture this trend."

He also pointed out that Bangladesh's growth has not been from the real sector but from service sector, the share of which grew to 51.4 percent. Since the service sector generates a little employment, this is suitable for countries such as the US, but not Bangladesh. In the extreme case, this may breed in a zero employment GDP growth

Debapriya also questioned a number of inconsistencies in the latest data of national income accounting and said the govern-

some of the issues capable of attracting more foreign investment. But it appreciated the strong measures proposed in line with the pronounced poverty reduction strategy

paper (PRSP) of the government. The new budget of Tk 643.83 billion, which is 15.7 percent higher than that of the current fiscal year, may look ambitious to some extent. But the Ficci felt the goals can be achieved with proper governance and monitoring.

"Attainment of the PRSP goals will benefit the foreign investors in Bangladesh," the chamber said.

The Ficci hailed the reduction of duty on cellphone handsets to Tk 300 from Tk 1,500. But the proposed tax of Tk 1,200 on each SIM card will slow down the build-up of the thriving sector, it said. "The telecoms sector is a strategic infrastructure for the economic development of the country."

The chamber also pointed out the budget proposal for audit of any return certified by chartered accountants under section 82 is not in line with the government's goal of simplification of the assessment process

It also observed that no significant measures have been proposed toward reformation of tax adminis-"We appreciate the retention of

Five other US soldiers were wounded Thursday when a suicide car bomber attacked their convoy between Beiji and Tikrit, 130km north of Baghdad, but none of the njuries was life-threatening, the nilitary said.
