Eating dangerously

Showcased sweetmeats not what they seem

Rasogolla, Kalojam, Chamcham, Jilapi, Paantoa, Shandesh, Mihidana, khirsa--these are the essential delicacies for all festivals in Bengali culture.

But food and sanitation officers from the Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) say most of these mouthwatering sweetmeats, despite looking attrac-

tive in the showcase, are made with adulterated ingredients and produced in a filthy environment.

In a survey conducted in February, DCC officials found that 100 percent of examined samples of Rasogolla, Kalojam, curds, and Sandesh were adulterated.

Consumers, when recently told about the findings,

Bangladesh dangerous place for journalists
US envoy comments

The outgoing US Ambassador Harry K Thomas yesterday said Bangladesh is a "dangerous place for journalists" whose job is the toughest in the country.

He made the comment while talking to reporters after a farewell meeting with Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman at his secretariat office.

The minister however rejected Thomas's remark and said the journalists of the country are enjoying much freedom except some isolated incidents.

"The dangerous place for journalists may be South America, surely

Bidisha gets bail in theft case

Despite securing bail yesterday in the theft case filed by her former husband HM Ershad, Bidisha was not yet let out, as she stands accused in a passport forgery case.

Judge Mohammad Monim Ullah of the Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court, Dhaka gave her an ad-interim bail after her counsel filed a criminal appeal against the bail rejection order of a lower court.

The Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's (CMM's) Court, Dhaka on June 8 rejected a petition for Bidisha's bail and sent her to Dhaka Central Jail. She was produced

Ministry dreads mayhem in CHT

UPDF, PCJSS rivalry getting stronger

The Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) affairs ministry fears that rivalry between pro-peace accord Parbattya Chattagram Jono Sanghati Samity (PCJSS) and United Peoples Democratic Front (UPDF), the outfit opposed to the accord, might anytime lead to extensive bloodshed in Khagrachari.

The ministry report on law and order of the three hill districts, which was submitted before the parliamentary standing committee on CHT affairs yesterday, voiced the concern. It recommended alerting the police, paramilitary Bangladesh Rifles (BDR), and army personnel to the possibility of violence.

The standing committee meeting chaired by Mosharraf Hossain at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban yesterday decided to invite state minister for home and BDR director general to discuss the law and order of the CHT in its next meeting.

The report said the law and order in Khagrachari is much worse compared with that of the previous years. The situation in the two other hill districts -- Rangamati and Bandarban -- is relatively stable.

"For now, the situation in Khagrachari appears to be under control thanks to stepped up activities of the police, BDR, and army, but a fierce fighting might break out anytime between PCJSS and UPDF

Saifur still in a fix

Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman yesterday said he is still in a dilemma over allowing black money for another year as proposed in the budget for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

"Still I'm in two minds," he told a delegation from Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE) at his office. The minister expressed this view when the delegates advocated for black money to be allowed in terms of investment in the capital market and industries.

Saifur kept mum about their call, but explained the pluses and minuses of allowing the money whitening provision the way he did in Friday's post-budget press conference.

The delegation led by DSE President Shahiq Khan apprehended the undeclared money

Kala-azar outbreak in Dinajpur

Two persons died of kala-azar or visceral leishmaniasis, and 35 were affected in Parbatipur and Phulbari upazilas in the last four days where an outbreak of the deadly parasitic fever is feared.

Sources in Phulbari and Parbatipur health complexes said among the 35 affected patients, the condition of five is critical.

The civil surgeon of Dinajpur yesterday admitted the outbreak of the disease in the district. He said they have an adequate reserve of vaccines, which have already been sent to the affected areas.

Essentials prices on the up again

Prices of daily necessities have increased in the city market after the new budget was proposed in parliament.

"We see a negative effect in the market when the price increases. But we have to increase the price as we buy at an increased rate," said Zakir Hossain, a trader in the Karwan Bazar market.

During a visit to the city's Karwan Bazar and Hatirjheel kitchen markets yesterday afternoon, it was found that the price of potatoes and cucumbers has increased from Tk 2 to four per kg within the last two days.


