Rafsanjani in slim lead

Run-off vote now certain

REUTERS, Tehran

Moderate cleric Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani held a narrow lead yesterday in Iran's presidential election, but was far short of outright victory, with an unprecedented runoff vote now certain, officials said.

Sources close to the Guardian Council, a watchdog body, said Rafsaniani had taken 21 percent of the 26.64 million votes counted from around 32 million cast in Friday's

Former Tehran mayor Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, a religious hard-liner, was in second place with 19.7 percent.

If they hold their edge over their nearest rival, reformist cleric Mehdi Karroubi, who had 17.8 percent of votes counted, the pair will square

off next Friday in a deciding election. Whoever wins, unelected Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei has the last word on state affairs and hard-liners hold key levers of power, such as security and the courts

Rafsanjani is a veteran politician who wants better ties with the West and would be likely to pursue a pragmatic reform program, liberalising the economy and preserving social freedoms without antagonizing the powerful clerical elite.

60 killed in Iraq violence

The US military said yesterday it killed about 50 insurgents since the start of another joint US-Iraqi operation against rebels in Irag's western Al-Anbar province near the Syrian horder while 10 Iragis were killed in two suicide bombings in the same province Fighting raged for the second

day yesterday in Karabilah, near Iraq's border with Syria, as US marines and Iragi soldiers swept through the area in search of insurgents and weapons. "Approximately 50 insurgents

have been killed since the operation began yesterday morning," said a military statement.

"There have been no additional reports of military or civilian casualties as a result of the operation." Operation Spear was launched

Friday morning

In a chilling discovery, troops found four Iraqi hostages who had been beaten, handcuffed and chained to a wall in a bunker in the town, US Captain Jeff Pool said.

"The operations objectives, to root out insurgent and foreign terrorist presence within the city and deny them the use of Karabilah as a sanctuary, are similar to Operation Matador conducted by Marines May 7-14." he said.

But unlike Matador, he said the 1,000 strong operation has more Iraqis taking part. Iraqi soldiers from the 1st Company, 2nd Battalion, 4th Brigade were involved he added without giving exact figures.
