## 8 BJMC mills closed on jute crisis

### Chairman, director blame each other for situation

The struggling jute sector faces a serious threat as almost half the state-run jute mills have closed down production because of a jute

Officials at the Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) said the jute crisis emerged while the chairman and director (production and ute) of the corporation blamed each other for the situation.
