PM for expansion of ties with Cuba in health sector

UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday said there is an ample scope to expand bilateral relations between Bangladesh and Cuba in various fields, particularly the health sector.

She made the remarks when newly appointed Cuban Ambassador to Bangladesh Jaun Carretero Ibanez called on her at the PM's office yesterday.

During the meeting, Ibanez informed the Prime Minister about Cuba's progress in biotechnology and medical science.

The Cuban Ambassador, who is based in New Delhi, said Cuba now exports various medicines, including vaccines against Hepatitis B and Influenza. In this regard, Khaleda pointed out that medicines from Bangladesh are also exported to more than 60 Sur

countries, including the USA. She suggested looking for ways how the two countries could better use their experiences.

Ibanez said the existing good friendly relations between the two countries should be expanded to intensify economic cooperation for the welfare of the people of the two countries.

The envoy conveyed greetings from the Cuban President Fiedel Castro to the Prime Minister.

Khaleda reciprocated and recalled her meeting with the Cuban President during the Nam Summit in

Kuala Lumpur.

Ibanez referred to the next Nam Summit to be held in Havana and said the Cuban people and the government will be happy to receive her during the Summit or any other bilateral visit.

Khaleda expressed her satisfaction as bilateral relations between the two countries intensified and cooperation in various international forums increased.

The Cuban envoy assured to work for taking the relationship between the two countries to a new height.

The Prime Minister also assured him of her government's total support during his tenure.
