'Graft grips every ministry'

Saifur finds NBR most affected, tells JS if he initiates actions against corrupt tax officials, revenue division will become empty

Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman yesterday told parliament that corruption had gripped every ministry of the government and it was regrettable that the National Board of Revenue (NBR) was the worst graft-infested department.

"There is no angel in any ministry... corruption, more or less, is everywhere," he said during the question-answer session.

Describing corruption as a disease, Saifur said, "I can name the ministries one by one, from education ministry to communications, where corruption pervades."

He was replying to a supplementary question of Jatiya Party (Ershad) lawmaker Hafizuddin Ahmed.

Saifur, however, defended his ministry by saying that the NBR is suffering from scarcity of efficient tax officials as appointments to the department have been halted for the

"If I initiate actions against the corrupt (tax) officials the entire revenue division will become empty," he said. "I can't do this as I have to run the office.'

"I have requested the establishment ministry to arrange special recruitment of tax officials immediately through the Public Service Commission," the minister informed the House.

As recruitment is on the hold for years, even peons have become tax

officers, Saifur mentioned.

He however informed the House that various measures were taken to increase tax and VAT collection.

Replying to another question, Saifur told the House that Bangladesh received foreign loans and grants of \$28,364 million since

He said the loans were received with a nominal interest rate or service charge (only one percent or below) from development partners including the World Bank, the Asian Development Bank, Japan, USA, UK, Saudi Arabia and other countries.

Saifur strongly supported consultancy by development partners in foreign-aided projects and said, "We get quality work through their

The finance minister made the comment when a lawmaker demanded cancellation of foreign consultancy in projects on the ground that consultants are gobbling up a good chunk of aid.

But the minister differed from this view and said, "Of the \$28,364 million in foreign loans and grants so far received, only 2 percent has been spent on consultancy."

Referring to efficiency of the World Bank consultants in the recently completed Dhaka-Sylhet highway, Saifur said, "We have got a quality road as the World Bank consultants were involved in it. If the locals did this, the road would have SEE PAGE 15 COL 2

'Mastermind' Jamaat leader arrested



Dhaka skips Delhi talks over delay in invitation

Bangladesh is not joining India and Myanmar in the talks on the proposed gas pipeline in New Delhi today, as it said the invitation came only a day ahead of the meeting.

Myanmar Energy Minister Lun Thi goes to New Delhi to explore an alternative route in case Bangladesh does not join the \$ Ibillion project.

"We have informed Bangladesh about the proposed talks between India and Myanmar on Wednesday,

and through the Bangladesh high commissioner forwarded an invitation to send an envoy to the talks," Indian Petroleum Minister Mani Shankar Aiyar told reporters at a teleconference from Romania on

In case the Bangladesh envoy arrives, "We will change the schedule into a trilateral talks or we will have bilateral talks with Myanmar,'

Advisor to the energy ministry Mahmudur Rahman told reporters

that Indian High Commissioner Veena Sikri met him yesterday and inquired about Bangladesh's participation in the meeting

Niko busy with gas

The blaze at Tengratila gas field started to subside on Monday night, shrinking to less than 100 feet by yesterday afternoon, amid continued demonstrations against the Canadian energy company, Niko.

But as the height of the flame reduced the emission of black smoke increased, polluting the entire environment, with hot sand, dust and ashes carried by the blowout turning the once green villages into grey. A dense black cloud hung lowin the sky.

"The fire situation remains unchanged, because the flame rises and drops time to time," remarked Doara Bazar Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Mohibuzzaman.

Despite the raging fire in the relief well, Niko continues with its gas field operations. It asked Dipon Gas, a local contractor, to keep working for setting up a distribution plant at Paribagh in Chhatak some 10 kilometres off Tengratila, Dipon Gas officials told The Daily Star.

A 16km pipeline was also being laid to bring gas from Tengratila to the plant. Niko officials told Dipon Gas staff they will not suspend exploration, because, according to their assessment, the 20-square-km area has a huge gas reserve.

Niko is also developing a new field at Barabond, around 8km from Tengratila, digging a well there and constructing a link road from Tengratila to Barabond.

ACC to visit Ctg port on anti-graft mission next week JULFIKAR ALI MANIK

Anti Corruption Commission (ACC) will go on a special drive in Chittagong seaport and customs next week to contain the alarming rise in corruption including 'monstrous bribery' and harassment of the traders.

In an unprecedented move, Prof Moniruzzaman Mian, one of the ACC Commissioners, will visit the port and customs with a team to assess at first hand the state of corruption in the country's lone seaport and find out ways to scale down

Since the constitution of the antigraft commission, the ACC chairman has often talked about corruption in different land and seaports, and customs, and expressed his resolve to combat the corruption. But eight months into its formation the much-vaunted ACC has yet to do
