New device to detect arsenic level below 10 microgram

It's simple and cheaper, scientists say

A new, simple and cheaper method to detect arsenic level in water has been evolved in Kushtia by a group of foreign scientists.

The team was led by a Kushtiaborn scientist, now a citizen of

Arsenic level less than 10 microgram per litre (ug/L) can be measured by using the method while those now used being in the country can not detect the contamination if it is below 50 microgram per litre.

The World Health Organization (WHO) - prescribed tolerable limit of arsenic in water for humans is 10 microgram per litre.

Thousands of people are being affected in the country with the deadly poison as they are unknowingly taking water with arsenic contamination of around 50 microgram per litre.

The new method is more accurate and precise and does not need use of atomic absorption spectrometer or other expensive equipment. according to the innovators.

In the 'arsenomolybdate' method arsenic can be detected by using a simple spectrophotometer, distillation unit for purifying water, analytical balance, top-loading balance, glassware, an arsine generator, scrubber and absorber and some very common reagents. All these cost Tk 6500 only while the methods now being used cost around Tk 37.000. Dr. Bibudhendra Sarkar, leader of team of foreign scientists, told this correspondent

Any household or a small community can set up a small laboratory, which will open a new dimension in supply of arsenic-free water,

after eight year's experiment in four Kushtia villages by volunteer scientists called Scientists Without Borders, headed by Dr Bibudhendra Sarkar of the Hospital for Sick Children and Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto,

The team included Dr Seth Frisbe, an environmental chemist. Dr Ericka Michel, a sociologist from Better Life Laboratories in Vermont, USA, Dr Donald Manyard of Johnson Company, Vermont, USA; Dr, Saul Sanchez, of Green

USA; Dr Richard Ortega of University of Bordeaus, Franch and Ahmad Zaki Yusuf and Mohammad Yusuf Siddique of BANI, Kushtia.

They worked by rotation in Bualda, Fulbari, Komlapur and Jamjami villages.

Recently, Dr Mustanzid of the Department of Surgery, Faridpur Medical College and Dr Fatema Ashraf, Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Rajshahi Medical College, joined the team.

Talking to this correspondent, Dr Mustanzid said they are now helping some individuals and small companies providing healthcare service in Kushtia to install small laboratories in the town. Gradually this will be expanded throughout the country.

Kushtia is one of the districts where the groundwater is highly contaminated with arsenic.

At least 63 per cent of the people in the district are facing the danger according to a survey made by a foreign NGO in 2002.

Criminals abducted a school boy after committing robbery in a house and demanded ransom for his

The incident took place at Kuthibhatpara village in Gangni upazila in Meherpur district early yesterday. At least 20 persons were also injured when the gang hurled bombs on them when neighbours tried to resist the criminals.

According to police, a gang of 14 stormed into the house Rafiqul Islam and confined family members at gunpoint. They demanded Tk worth about Tk 50,000.

Boy abducted to press for

The gang at gunpoint picked up Rafiqul's son Faruk, 14, a student of class IX at Hinda High School.

The injured neighbours were admitted to Gangni Health Complex and Meherpur General Hospital. A case has been filed with Gangni police but police could not trace the boy when the report was filed yesterday afternoon.

The villagers alleged that police was informed in time but they did not go to the spot at night. They went the village in the morning.

On June 18, people at Bamund village in the same upazila caught eight policemen when they came to commit robbery at a house. Villagers claimed that after the incident, police are not willing to move at night.

As many as 28 people, most of them school and college students and businessmen, were abducted from different places in the district since January.

Of them, 4 were killed and 21 bought their freedom after paying ransom. Two are missing. Organised gangs and outlaws are responsible for the abductions,

7 get life for double Juvenile crimes on murder in Dumuria

Seven persons have been sentenced to life term imprisonment and fined Tk 50,000 each for murder of BNP activists Abul Kashem alias Khokon Biswas and Yunus Gazi in Dumuria on May 9,

Twenty-nine accused were chargesheeted in the case.

Those convicted to life term are slain founder of outlawed New Biplobi Communist Party (NBCP) Monoranjon Goshai alias Mrinal, Dipankar Mondol, Zakir Morol, Nasir Molla, Debu Prashad Roy alias Debu, Pravat Mondol and Tapan Basak.

Nineteen chargesheeted accused have been acquitted.

Debu Prashad Roy alias Debu and Pravat Mandol are in Khulna District Jail while the five others

are absconding Md Abdus Samad, Judge of Khulna Speedy Trial Tribunal,

delivered the verdict on sunday. BNP activists Abul Kashem and Yunus Gazi were abducted

from a marriage ceremony at Rajapur village in Dumuria upazila of Khulna district at arms point at about 5-30 pm on May 9, 2003. They were gunned down at a place near the house of Kismat Morol of the same village.

Sub Inspector Wahidul Islam lodged an FIR with Dumuria thana as complainant on May 11 without naming any accused.

Charge sheet of the case was submitted by the IO on January 30 last year, accusing 29 persons.

The trial began on February 7 this year. Two out of 29 chargesheeted accused --Nooruddin AL Masud and Sarwar Molongi -- were exempted from the case on March 20 this year by the High Court. Another accused-Shukumar alias Taru -- died

desire for a second marriage. Soon after the incident, police arrested Mujibar Rahman's two brothers--Jahangir and Shahjahan, who were also allegedly involved in the murder. But police were playing a dubious role in investigating case as the killers are the sons of a well to

do family, four daughters of the victim alleged whole talking to this

correspondent Saturday night. They said they are now hiding in a house in Dhaka as their father threatened them because they did not agree to his proposal to testify to police that their mother committed suicide. They have also filed a general diary with Mirpur thana in

Dhaka, they said. The four daughters of Mujibar rahman are Sonia, Tania, Arifa and Farzana. Two of them are married.

They said finding no alternative. they met with the IGP on Saturday at his office and sought his help. They also demanded immediate arrest and punishment to the killers. The IGP directed Shyamnagar police to send the case to the District Monitoring Cell, nab the killers and probe the case, they said.
