# Illegal diagnostic labs mushrooming

Around 450 laboratory and diagnostic centres in the city are operating without the approval from the Directorate General of Health Service (DGHS), say sources.

According to statistics, until May 30 this year 525 laboratories and diagnostic centres have been registered under the DGHS. However, the total number of such medical facilities is believed to be more than a thousand

"The numbers are increasing rapidly. After May 30, five or six more labs and diagnostic centres have started business without our approval," said Dr. Mahmud Hussain, a senior official of DGHS.

"We run inspections twice a week. We also alert defaulting institutions through the print and electronic media that they should obtain licenses as soon

as possible," he added. An investigation carried out by Star City showed that diagnostic centres such as Auto Path, Unipath, New Diagnostic, Memory Diagn-ostic, The Diagnostic Lab and some other laboratories lacked basic facilities like pathological labs, doctor's chambers, trained employees and nurses. The environment inside these diagnostic centres also appeared unhy-

used was outdated. Very few patients actually turn up at these labs. The pathologists and lab technicians were also not skilled enough to perform critical tests.

When inquired about the trade license, the manager of The Diagnostic Lab said that if they obtain one, then they would have to pay renewal fees and VAT (Value Added Tax) every year. "That is why we have not applied for a license," he said.

"Although there are unauthorised diagnostic labs in residential areas, these are however needed for the sake of residents as the number of government hospitals is not sufficient," said Dr. Md. Moniruzzaman Bhuiyan, president of Bangladesh Clinic and Diagnostic Owners Associ-

A section of doctors also refer patients to unauthorised labs for tests. Some diagnostic centres have even employed representatives to persuade doctors into referring people to them in exchange of 'commission' and other benefits. The unsuspecting patients often pay the price for their unconditional faith in certain doctors.

"I have had my blood examined at two diagnostic centres. The two reports are completely different. I am totally confused now," said Ziaul Hasan while

> "We have no fixed rates. The rates are negotiated on basis of understanding among owners of various centres," admitted owner of a diagnostic lab at Moghbazar.

Many blame the DGHS for not exercising enough control over unauthorised diagnostic

Although rules stipulate regular visits by officials of the directorate for checking whether diagnostic centres have necessary manpower, equipment and devices, no such inspection had taken place in years, claimed a senior official of the DGHS.

However, Md. Abdur Rahman Khan, the director general of DGHS denied the allegation.

"We supervise unregistered centres and ask them to take approval by fulfilling our conditions. We take legal actions if they fail to do so.

"The Health and Family Welfare Ministry and DGHS have begun the gradual process of reforming the health sector including modernising the facilities of diagnostic centres," he said.

# Shilpakala theatre halls limping for lack of manpower

Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy's two experimental theatre halls in the city may be shut down soon due to lack of man-

High officials of the academy said the halls are now temporarily closed for servicing the airconditioners but other staff said it is due to lack of manpower.

"There is no payment for the staff for the last one year. So most of the staff are leaving," an official said on condition on anonymity. "The phone lines are discon-

nected and even the internal PABX system is out of order. Sadly, there is no staff to fix these problems." he said. Some 27 employees and nine

ushers who are working on a daily basis under the National Theatre Stage project have not been paid since July last year.

Many technical staff have stopped coming to the theatre halls. They are leading an inhu-

man life since they are not paid their wages.

"My family is in deep trouble. I have to shift to a slum as I could not pay my house rent. Now I cannot even manage to feed my family," said a technician.

Academy and Joint Secretary of Cultural Affairs Ministry Abdur Razzak said now everything depends on the finance ministry.

Meanwhile, the staff of the two halls have given an ultimatum to the authorities that if they do not receive their arrears, they will finally leave by July 30.

Officials said this will cause a huge loss to the Tk 38 crore project as there will be no skilled hand to run the machines and no security officials to guard them.

The rent for the small hall with 350 seats is Tk 3,000 per half shift while that of the big hall having 700 seats is Tk 7,500.

The money that comes from rent goes to the academy fund which otherwise could be shared among the employees who are not getting salaries, said an employee.
