

## 1 nabbed in Bandarban with 1,200 M16 bullets

Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) yesterday arrested an alleged criminal with 1,200 bullets of M16 rifle from Tarabunia in Naikhangchhari upazila.

Acting on a tip off, a BDR team led by Lt Col Auwal, Bir Pratik raided a hideout in the deep forest and seized the ammunition.

The BDR, who also seized 10 sets of uniforms, did not give details about the arrestee.

## Ex-cabinet secy Akbar tipped to become first tax ombudsman

Akbar Ali Khan, alternative executive director of the World Bank and former cabinet secretary, may become the first tax ombudsman of the country while incumbent Commerce Secretary Siddiqui Rahman is going to be the finance secretary.

The tax ombudsman bill was passed in the last budget session.

Akbar Ali Khan, who earlier served as cabinet secretary, finance secretary, and NBR chairman, is expected to complete his present assignment as the alternative executive director of the World Bank this month.

He is under consideration as the most potential person for appointment to the post of tax ombudsman

## BNP moves to rid leaders of criminal charges

The high-ups of ruling BNP have decided to gather information on the cases, which they termed "politically motivated", filed against BNP leaders and activists during the immediate past Awami League (AL) government, in a bid to relieve them of criminal charges.

BNP leaders including lawmakers, who witnessed the framing of charges against BNP men during the last AL government, will accumulate necessary information and forward it to the home ministry. The home ministry will then apply to the law ministry, which will finally proceed to the court for the withdrawal

of the cases, BNP lawmaker Syed Moazzem Hossain told The Daily Star yesterday.

The decision was taken at a meeting at the Local Government and Rural Development (LGRD) ministry on Monday with BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan in the chair.

The meeting asked the Ministry of Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs and the Ministry of Home Affairs to initiate the release process on an urgent basis.

Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) Mayor Sadeque Hossain Khoka, State Minister for Home Affairs Lutfozzaman Babar, BNP standing committee member Advocate

Khandakar Mahbubuddin Ahmed, BNP city unit General Secretary Abdus Salam, SA Khaleque, Salahuddin Ahmed, Nasiruddin Ahmed Pintu, a few public prosecutors (PP) of Dhaka courts, local ward commissioners and lawyers of BNP-backed Jatiyatabadi Ainjibi Oikya Parishad attended the meeting.

"Thousands of false cases framed by the Awami League government with political motivation are still pending in the courts due to lack of party efforts and we have asked the ministries concerned to look into the matter immediately," Moazzem Hossain, who also attended the meeting, said.

## 11 militants brought in Dhaka for quizzing

### Primary probe reveals existence of more dangerous outfit

The 11 militants arrested from Puthiapa village in Paba upazila on Tuesday were sent to a joint interrogation cell (JIC) in Dhaka last night after a primary analysis of a recovered diary confirmed the identity of the suspected combative-trainer.

Following a home ministry directive, the militants were sent to Dhaka escorted by huge police guards at

around 11:00pm. The JIC team will start its interrogation from today morning.

The militants were arrested in a joint block raid to a newly constructed house of one Mozammel Haque Mozam at Puthiapa village.

Four groups of police and intelligence agencies comprising deputy inspector general (DIG), superintendent of police (SP) and senior offi-

cials interrogated the militants on Tuesday night and the following day, but could not bring out any remarkable information from them.

Combat trainer Aslam identified The investigators identified Golam Mustafa, one of the arrestees, as the suspected combat instructor Aslam after matching his handwriting with that of a hand-written diary recovered from the militants.

## Five souls in dowry hell

Nupur, Sufia, Aleya, Shilpi and Shamima -- they were five young brides whose dream of a happy conjugal life has been shattered by a cruel greed for dowry of in-laws and husbands.

They are now four, as Shamima died of severe burn injuries on June 10.

Of the surviving quartet, doctors at Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) in the last week of June released Shilpi repeatedly stabbed by her husband, while a severely burnt Nupur left the hospital Monday exasperated at the lack of food and accommodation for her attendants.

The remaining two touched by the hellfire of dowry are still languishing at the DMCH, looking with horror to the bleak future awaiting them like an never-ending winter.

TALE OF NUPUR

Nupur Begum, 20, was admitted to Ward 33 of the DMCH on June 29 with acute burn injuries inflicted by her husband.

Almost half of her body, from waist upward, scorched and banded, she sees interminable flow of pus from the burnt areas soaking the thick bandages.

Her day-labourer mother, Mariam, knows that Nupur's condition is very bad, but the family of four, including Nupur's younger sister Shanta and 3-year-old son Rabbi, has no way to get the money for the very expensive treatment.

After their marriage, Nupur's taxi-driver husband Hanif forced the 16-year-old bride to quit her job as an operator at GK Garments in Savar that earned her Tk 2,600 a month. Thus stopping the financial support to Mariam, Hanif shifted Nupur to Kumkumari village in Savar.

## SAVAR EPZ 200 agitating workers hurt in clash with cops

Over 200 workers of a garment factory at Savar EPZ (Export Processing Zone) were injured, five of them seriously, in a police action yesterday.

The seriously injured workers are Mahmuda, 20, Zahurul, 20, Shahnaj, 22, Billal, 25, Wasim, 22 and Sujon, 20.

Police swung into action when hundreds of workers of Ring Shine factory were enforcing a strike for the fourth consecutive day demanding withdrawal of false cases against some workers of the factory and to realise their "legitimate demands".

The injured workers alleged that police swooped on them in front of the EPZ gate and at different entry

points and charged baton without any provocation

"Police also fired rubber bullets," said one of them.

The injured workers said many of them did not go to any hospital, fearing further police harassment and arrest.

The workers of the factory alleged that police raided Gazirchat, Pallibidyut, Bhadail and Dhamrai early yesterday and picked up about 70 innocent workers.

Later, police released 48 of them. Meanwhile, protesting police attack, the National Garments Workers Welfare Association held a meeting at their Baipail office in Savar in the afternoon.

## Octane price should be raised by another Tk 10

Says energy adviser

The price of octane should be raised by another Tk 10 a litre, Mahmudur Rahman, adviser to the energy ministry said yesterday, a day after the government raised the prices of octane and petrol.

"Although most of the consumers of octane in our country are rich, the price of octane has not been increased since January 2003. But the prices of diesel and kerosene were raised several times," he said.

The energy adviser was speaking at a meeting organised by Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry (DCCI) in Dhaka. "We need a pro-people policy in the pricing of fuels to ensure equal distribution of

## 3 more districts inundated

Floods have engulfed three more districts and fresh areas of the affected ones, worsening the situation further.

With inundation of three districts Natore, Naogaon and Faridpur the number of flood affected districts now stands at seven.

The low-lying areas of Natore, Naogaon and Faridpur have gone under floodwater, marooning hundreds of people and damaging standing crops on vast tracts of land.

Meanwhile, the overall flood situation in Sirajganj, Lalmonirhat, Nilphamari and Gainbandha deteriorated further, as fresh areas of the affected districts have been inundated.

According to Flood Forecasting

and Warning Centre (FFWC), the prevailing flood situation of Kurigram, Nilphamari, Gaibandha, Sylhet, Sunamganj, and Netrakona are likely to deteriorate further.

The flood situation in the low-lying areas in and around Dhaka and Narayanganj remained unchanged.

In Gaibandha, The flood situation in the district deteriorated further, as the rivers Ghagat, Korotoa, Teesta continued to rise and many fresh areas went under water.

According to local water development board sources, the Ghagat marked further rise by 27cm, Korotoa by 16cm and Teesta by 11cm in the last 24 hours.

Fresh areas in Sirajganj went under floodwaters in the last 24
