'Ensure minimum standard of migrants' rights'

Foreign Secretary Hemayetuddin yesterday called on the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) to create a global recognition of the need for a minimum standard of the migrants'

"While international legal instruments aimed at promoting the protection of refugees and migrant workers and combating trafficking in persons exist, there is no comprehensive legal framework governing the cross-border movement of the people," he said at the concluding

Stressing the need for linking the Trade in Services (GATS), covers only a very small percentage of annual cross-border movement of

The precise boundaries of Mode-4 that allows overseas employment only of the skilled manpower are not well defined and this lack of definitional clarity poses challenges for migration officials, he said, adding that identifying the scope of Mode-4 remains a major task.

Calling for establishing a regular migration regime, Hemayetuddin said the lack of regular channels of migratory movement pushes the migration underground with inevitable links to gun-running, drugs and other trans-boundary crimes.

AKM Shamsuddin, secretary of the Ministry of Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment, said migration liberalisation is an agenda that needs to be addressed with global cooperation and the GATS.

The least developed countries like Bangladesh that view migration as an important livelihood option

stand much to gain from proper implementation and broadening of the GATS negotiations, he said.

While globalisation continues to spur the free flow of goods, services and capital, the marginalisation of labour mobility has created asymmetries and distortions in the global economy, he added.

"Many economists are now reaffirming that there is really no purely theoretical argument, which can justify free trade without justifying free migration at the same time."

Dr Mustafizur Rahman, research director of the Centre for Policy Dialogue, chaired the session attended by Shahidul Haque, IOM South Asian regional representative, Anne Marchal, first secretary of the European Commission, and representatives from Bangladesh International Recruiting Agencies and other migration development organisations.




