

# Six injured as prisoners clash in Dhaka Central Jail

At least six inmates of Dhaka Central Jail were injured, two of them critically, in a clash between two rival groups over drug trade on Tuesday, according to jail sources. The injured are Amjad (22280/02), Jabbar (16206/98), Nazrul Islam (9225/04), Babu

(27335/05), Al Amin (24283/03) and Siraj Bepari (5570/A). They are now undergoing treatment at the jail hospital. According to the sources, the incident took place in the evening when two groups of prisoners, reportedly backed by notorious Sweden Aslam and Kala Jahangir groups, locked in an altercation

over the drug trade inside the jail. At one stage, Sweden Aslam group swooped on Kala Jahangir men and started stabbing them. "The attackers stabbed them in the neck and back with a motive to kill," sources said, adding: "But the jail police took the situation under control."

# Cyber games contest from Aug 26

The World Cyber Games 2005 Bangladesh Championship, the first of its kind in the country, will kick off at the Bashundhara City Shopping Centre in Dhaka on August 26. A total of 1,000 participants will take part in two computer games -- Need for Speed Underground 2 and FIFA 2005 -- in the contest. Winners of this contest will represent Bangladesh in the grand finals to be held in Singapore in November this year. Officials of F1 Management Limited, organiser of the contest, disclosed this at

a press conference at Pizza Hut, a fast food shop, in the city yesterday. Djuiice, a popular brand of GrameenPhone, Bashundhara City Shopping Centre and Sparkle Company are sponsoring the three-day championship. To register for the championship, one has to take part in an SMS ((Short Message Service) quiz contest using a Djuiice subscription. The questions will be published in daily newspapers through advertisement, said Md Irfan Hussain, chief coordinator of the championship, at the press conference. Some 1,000 winners will be selected through this quiz contest. The last date of

sending answers to the quiz through SMS is August 13. The first World Cyber Games Championship, considered to be the 'Olympics of the Computer Games', was held in 2001.
