mission refers to the central bank's informal direction in March to the commercial banks to keep the nighest price of dollar at Tk 63.70, which did help steady the dollar price for a few weeks.

The IMF report also pointed out that as the nationalised commercial banks (NCBs) were allowed to exceed the limits on their net open positions, a two-tier pricing developed between the NCBs and the private banks emerged, with a 0.6 percent spread at its peak.

Against this backdrop, the IMF urged the government to adhere to market-based principles in the foreign exchange market, not to control the exchange rate and to allow the exchange rate to reflect the market forces.

In response, BB Deputy Governor Allah Malik Kazemi in a letter dated June 26 to IMF Managing Director Rodrigo de Rato committed not to interfere in the foreign exchange market.

'Bangladesh remains committed to maintaining a market based flexible exchange rate system," he affirmed and said, "Relying on market mechanism to adjust to exchange market pressures, Bangladesh Bank is not now resort ing to, and does not intend to resort to suasion for this purpose.'

Kazemi also informed the IMF MD that the long-persisting divergence between the exchange rates quoted by the NCBs and other banks has been narrowed down. He assured. "Bangladesh Bank is keeping continuous watch to prevent tendency to re-emergence of any significant divergence and will ensure that this does not exceed 2 percent.'

The binding commitment makes the BB unable to take any direct measure to halt the ongoing dollar price hike. But, the government is greatly worried over the situation, as t would further worsen the current nflationary spiral.

Sources said following the firstever meeting of the high-powered fiscal co-ordination council early this week, where the dollar price spiral featured prominently, the BB took some indirect measures to stabilise

Sources said on the central bank's informal instructions, Bangladesh Foreign Exchange Dealers Association (Bafeda) and the Association of Bankers. Bangladesh (ABB) held meetings on the issue and took a number of decisions to rein in price spiral.

ABB President Aminuzzaman said thev would adopt a special mechanism so that taka cannot depreciate further. But he did not disclose any details of the mecha-
