The country's exporters have put the post-MFA doomsayers to shame by fetching approximately \$8.58 billion in fiscal year (FY) 2004-05 or nearly \$1 billion more than \$7.60

"Exports saw a tremendous surge last fiscal, fetching around one billion dollars more than the previous fiscal. It proved wrong the fear and predictions at home and abroad that our exports might stumble in the second half of FY05, suffering a

major setback due to elimination of the MFA [Multi-fibre Agreement] quotas," said a top official of the commerce ministry.

According to Export Promotion Bureau (EPB), the total export earning in the first 11 months of FY05 was \$7,785 billion. The EPB is vet to finish calculating June's export figure but estimates it to be more than \$800 million, which puts the annual earning at \$8.585 billion, slightly more than the targeted

Arafat Ali Khan, a freedom fighter, has been suffering untold miseries with an amputated leg for more than a month at Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH).

Arafat, 76, of Daulatpur vilage of Netrokona, was left at the DMCH by some unknown persons following an accident after he had arrived in the capital. Only a week ago the hospital authorities came to know that he is a freedom fighter and admitted him in the orthopaedic ward.

Once a valiant soldier of the Bangladesh Rifles (BDR), Arafat was shown absconding following the political unrest in 1975. This deprived him of all kinds of


