Eminent dramatist Mamunur Rashid will inaugurate the rally. A discussion will be held at the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh auditorium. Dr Kamal Hossain, president of Gono Forum, will be the chief guest while Bodhipriya Larma alias Shantu Larma will chair the discussion.
