# Hygiene drive to spread out across the country

Babar pledges to go to any length to end food adulteration

The ongoing mobile-court clampdown on selling of adulterated, substandard and unhygienic food will soon be expanded to cover the entire country with stepped up logistic facilities.

The government also will 'go to any length' within the law to bring the food adulterators and standard violators to book, said State Minister

for Home Affairs Lutfozzaman Babar yesterday.

The people responsible for ensuring quality and hygiene of food will also be punished for any collusion with the adulterators or negligence in duty, he told the press coming out of a meeting on activities of the mobile courts.

"Through the mobile courts' operations, we've newly learned many diverse ways of food adulteration," he noted and said, "I'll take any step to stop the crime. Because, we must safeguard our people from

Fresh from an official visit to the USA, Babar said the number of mobile courts working in the capital soon will be trebled to 12. Every police station in the capital needs a court, he observed, but the government lacks magistrates, support

#### 3 of a family murdered in B'baria

Unidentified assailants killed three of a family in Medda area of the district town early yesterday.

The victims were identified as Mohammad Akhter Hossain, 37, a first class contractor of LGED, his wife Sabrina Akhter, 26, and their three-year-old daughter Arna.

Police quoted family sources as saying the assailants entered Akhter's residence, M A Bhaban, cutting the grill of a window at around 1:00am and hacked the three to death.

According to family sources, Akter along with his wife and daughter went to bed at night on August 10. As they did not wake up the following morning, his brothers and neighbours went to the residence and found Akhter and his daughter Arna lying in a pool of blood in a bed and Ákhter's wife Sabrina on the floor of heir bedroom.

On information, police rushed to he spot, recovered the bodies and sent them to Bramanbaria Sadar Hospital for autopsy.

According to hospital and family

sources, Sabrina Akter was at the advance stage of pregnancy.

Police could not unearth any clues to the triple murder nor arrest anybody as of the filing of this report at 5:30pm yesterday.

# Rebels kill 6 US soldiers

US forces announced the loss of six soldiers as top Iraqi leaders met separately to thrash out differences on the country's constitution as an August 15 deadline loomed.


The latest deaths raised the US military toll since March 2003 invasion to 1,834 as of Wednesday, according to an AFP tally based on

the Pentagon figures.

Insurgents also killed at least 14 other Iraqis across the country, and kidnapped an Iraqi police general, Khodr Abbas al-Salihi, in Baghdad. The six US soldiers died and six

others were wounded in three rebel attacks on Tuesday, the military said. The last three weeks have been

#### Warne breaks 600-wicket barrier

Shane Warne became the first bowler to take 600 Test wickets when he had Marcus Trescothick caught behind on the first day of the third Test against England at Old Trafford here Thursday.

The 35-year-old Australia legspin great reached the landmark in his 126th Test when, in his fifth over, he had Trescothick, trying to sweep, taken by Adam Gilchrist, the ball rolling up the wicket-keeper's leg before he held on to leave England 163 for two.
