

# Inspired by nature

# KMA Quayyum's exhibition at Saju Art Gallery

MA Quayyum in his ongoing exhibition at Saju Art Gallery lures you into gazing for hours at details of nature. He is of the opinion that we owe a lot to nature. He combines reality with exaggeration and imagination and brings before you compositions of petals, buds and leaves in a manner that you find irresistible. Quayyum does not believe in going into abstracts. He draws his inspiration from nature that surrounds him in plenty in Chittagong, adding imagination to his presentation, so that it does not appear photographic. Thus his petals and pistils sometimes appear larger than the leaves and trees that surround them. At times he goes in to present human figures, which he does in a Marc Chagall-like manner, so that they appear to be floating before you.

Quayyum, as a student of the Dhaka Art College in the early '70s, and the Chittagong University, had Rafiqun Nabi, Mahmudul Haque, Rashid Chowdhury, Devdas Chakravarty and Murtaja Baseer as his teachers. "At different times I've had different masters in mind such as Chagall, Picasso and Dali." the artist says. " I haven't always dealt with nature. Once I dealt with social pressures. It's now that I've gone in entirely for the simple and exotic." He has been a teacher of drawing and painting in Chittagong for 30

In one of his paintings, Golden kernel, one feels one is confronted with a half of a jack-fruit or pineapple dissected and coloured with the hues of paradise. Heart of nature has seeds and the fleshy centre of flower . "These exotic living things

are a symbol of pulsating life," says the artist. Column with leaves, brings us to more eastern plants and their fleshy leaves that appear to be swaying and dancing with colours. The leaves are reddish, blue and green while the glistening tree branch is black and gray.

A section of the exhibition contains paintings from Bandarban. Heart of nature, an oil, again deals with leaves. The beautiful, tiny, purple flowers that you find in the grass are elaborated in Wilderness. Another picture of colourful leaves is seen when they are held against a purple moon and are bathed in orange and yellow. Yet another painting is a delineation of hyacinths seen with myna birds. Travelling vendor brings in a human figure with a basket of fruits and vegetables. Alone on a seashore depicts seashells on a banana leaf on the heach, with the moon, skies and the beach on the backdrop.

The figure work that has been included in the exhibition appears to be floating in a dream. The portrait of a woman has her carrying a water vessel; the man is playing a flute; the bullock cart with the newly weds sways homewards. The paintings have lotus, moon and tiny birds included in the composition.

Quayyum often makes sketches for his paintings in his sketch book and develops them later when he moves on to the canvas. He eniovs both watercolour and acrylic, and oils have been his passion for

Quayyum has won six awards including the Shilpakala Award in the 12th National Art Exhibition. He has had three solos and many group shows overseas and at home

# Irish rockers U2 honoured by Portugal goes to Bollywood



Portugal awarded Irish rockers U2 the country's Order of Liberty on Sunday to honour the band's humanitarian efforts.

President Jorge Sampaio awarded the Dublin four -lead singer Bono, guitarist The Edge, bassist Adam Clayton and drummer Larry Mullen Jr. -- the order at the presidential palace a few hours before a concert in

Bono urged the Portuguese to help Africa, saying it was unacceptable for children to go hungry and 3,000 a day died from malaria, Lusa news agency reported.

Sampaio said that in the last 25 years the band had "combined the public exposure it received from its musical success with the protection of humanitarian

The president especially praised the band's efforts to help ease the debt burdens of poor nations.

Bono was a major figure in the Live Aid concert for Ethiopian famine relief 20 years ago and has since campaigned for the world's poor. U2 were also involved in last month's Live 8 concert held to pressure rich nations to alleviate poverty.

# **Kronos Quartet**

David Harrington of the Grammy-winning string ensemble Kronos Quartet says his group jumped at the chance to work with legendary Indian singer Asha Bhonsle and take its eclectic chamber music to Bollywood.

In choosing songs for the group's latest album, all of them composed by Bhonsle's late husband, RD Burman, Harrington said he selected those that appealed to his ear as a musician, with no understanding of their Hindi and Bengali lyrics.

It wasn't until days before Kronos began recording last summer that Harrington realised the group had put together a collection of plaintive love songs, many of them lesser-known examples of Burman's songcraft.

"I was reacting to the music totally as a listener and as a musician," the violinist told Reuters in an interview. The song selection surprised Bhonsle, too, but she felt they had rendered a strong sense of Burman as a composer, he

The result was You've Stolen My Heart: Songs from R.D. Burman's Bollywood, to be released on August 23 by the New York-based independent label Nonesuch Records

# Murtaja Baseer Covering 55 years on canvas



Murtaja Baseer's fortnight long exhibition on works of 55 years at the Bengal Gallery opens today.

The exhibit includes his pen-and-ink drawing of the '50s. In the same decade he did some linocuts and lithos depicting landscape and figures. Next he did variations of cubism.

Later, using triangles and squares, Baseer went to celebrate life and nature, ignoring the seamy side of life. In the '60s Baseer was overcome by ennui and loneliness. During the Liberation War that followed he

commemorated martyrs with a simple arrangement of pebbles.

In the late '70s he dealt with motifs taken from religious amulets and prayer mats and was drawn away by his fascination by the world of numismatics. In 1992 he resumed painting and went into stylised folk painting using the colours of the Pala paintings of Bengal.

The exhibition which begins today coincides with the artists birthday.
