Govt urged to expand social safety nets

The All-Party Parliamentary Group on Bangladesh Development Forum (BDF) and World Trade Organisation (WTO) was formally launched yesterday, aiming to protect economy and ensure social justice.

The parliamentary group is comprised of 11 lawmakers from BNP, Awami League, Jatiya Party (Ershad) and Jamaat-e-Islami as its founder executive board members and patrons.

"Being the people of a developing country, we the parliamentarians feel the question of food sovereignty, the need to protect our agriculture, trade, economy and the urgency to ensure economic and social justice must not be diluted with partisan politics while meeting the challenges of globalisation and trade liberalisation," its Chairperson Md Abu Hena of BNP said while reading out the declaration of the group at a press conference.

The parliamentary group urged the government to address the moral and social implications of globalisation and trade liberalisation by reshaping social services and enhancing social safety nets in order to support social justice within an open economy.

It called on the developed countries to provide wider market access to exports from LDCs, including Bangladesh, and supplement more rapid debt relief with an increased

'There was a restaurant at this place in previous times too." the curator said. "The tourism corporation has also a plan for renovation of the restaurant, closed a year ago due to financial constraint," he added.

Besides, there were three more eateries inside the zoo. All of those were shut down following allegations of harassing the visitors to the zoo.

Cervical cancer screening test begins today

Bangladesh Cancer Foundation Hospital will begin a week-long cervical (uterus) cancer screening test programme on its Lalmatia premises in the city today.

The programme includes regis tration of clients with a fee of Tk 300. The charge includes physical examination by a specialist gynaecologist, who is also a cancer specialist, a painless diagnostic test called pap smear test to detect uterus cancer and advice, based on the test report, from the physician
