# Eden girl's body recovered from college pond

The body of a female student of Eden College was recovered from a pond inside the college in the early hours vesterday.

She was identified as Kaniz Fatema Fancy, a second year student of accounting and resident of room no 117 of Khadiza Mahila Hostel

Fellow students said they informed Lalbag Police at around midnight after Fancy was missed from 10:00pm. They saw her seated near the pond at about 9:30pm.

Police came to the college and called the divers of the fire brigade after finding a pair of sleepers on the bank of the pond

The divers recovered the body from the pond and took it to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital where the doctors on duty declared her dead

# **Report on measures** to mitigate arsenic crisis

### SC asks govt

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court yesterday directed the government to report on the measures taken to mitigate arsenic contamination in water.

The directive came following an appeal filed by renowned lawyer Barrister Rabia Bhuiyan.

The appellant submitted that said the state has obligations under the constitution and international instruments on human rights to ensure people's access to safe drinking water.

Obligations of the state in this egard include taking reasonable legislative and other measures within its available resources to ensure the right to have access to safe water and emergency relief for persons and communities affected by arsenic contamination, she said.

Court, challenging the failure of the government to take effective and adequate steps to protect the constitutionally guaranteed right to life, including the right to access to safe water

The writ petition stated the authorities failed to seal up arsenic contaminated tube-wells, make emergency provision for safe drinking water and raise public awareness about the danger of drinking arsenic-contaminated water.

While the High Court dismissed the writ petition, the Appellate Division granted leave to appeal.



At least two people were injured in an explosion when a criminal was making bombs at a city slum at Shyampur yesterday. Police arrested injured

Mohammad Manik and sent him to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital for treatment in a critical condition as his hands, face, head and chest were hit by splinters.

Police said Manik is a listed criminal and was arrested a few months ago in a robbery case. Manik told the police that he forced the owner to allow him to work in the room at about 3:30pm. Neighbours informed the police

after a bomb exploded with a bang at a room of the slum behind the Dhaka Match Factory. They told the police that the owner of the room was taken to a private hospital before they (police) came there. Police recovered some materials from the spot used to make bombs.
