Claiming him as an accomplice of Bangla Bhai, the letter sender asked Prof Siddique to pay the cash to a person mentioned in the previous letter at Hotapara in Gazipur within 10 days.

The letter reads "You have failed to pay the money earlier and it is the last time for you. If you do not pay the money, you would not survive anymore. Your condition will be that of Prof Humayun Azad."

The letter also claimed that his group blasted bombs across the country including on the Dhaka University campus on August 17.
