India to push on with Iranian pipeline plan

Energy-hungry India said vesterday i would push on with plans to build a \$7 billion gas pipeline from Iran undaunted by the increasing threat of United Nations sanctions against Tehran.

The International Atomic Energy Agency on Friday said questions remained about Tehran's atomic activities and confirmed Iran had resumed its nuclear fuel work, setting the scene for a possible referral to the UN Security Council.

When asked what effect such political pressures could have on the pipeline project, Indian Foreign Ministry spokesman Navtej Sama told

reporters: "We have an interest in taking it forward, India needs gas."
