

Former Bangladesh captain Khaled Mahmud was in two minds about his future in the Bangladesh national The all-rounder, whose contract

with the Bangladesh Cricket Board ends in October, wants a long break from international cricket to think "I am not sure whether it was my last match or not," he said after

Bandladesh's last one-dayer against Sri Lanka at the Premadasa Stadium on Sunday. "I haven't thought like that. We have no series recently and I am under

contract until October. I have to talk with the cricket board first but not before it ends." said one of the country's leading one-day wicket-takers. "Like everyone, I want to play too. But the way I am playing. I feel

like I am a burden in the team. There's no need to stay just to bowl five overs in a one-day match," said Mahmud who was substituted in the first match, did not play in the second and was used as a supersub on

"With a lot of youngsters coming, think they should be given the chance. But I have to think more before retiring because I worked very hard on my fitness ahead of this tour. Suddenly saving 'no' is difficult.

"But I think it is high time for me. always wanted to go out at the right moment. I've played a lot and I am still enjoying international cricket.

Saying 'no' now would be a whimsical decision," added the 34year-old Mahmud who will be sent home after the one-day series.

Ankle and elbow injuries ruled the 35-year-old out of the second and fourth Tests but McGrath insists he will be ready to help Australia try and claim victory next week and retain the Ashes

He told The Mail on Sunday: "It's back to business as usual for the fifth Test. I've made a full recovery and will definitely play at The Oval.

"It has been so frustrating sitting out two of the first four Tests, but now I can get at the England batsmen in the decider."
